

Rev. Dr. Tim Archibald Lead Minister

She was turning 105 and was being interviewed on CBC Radio. I've forgotten her name but I certainly haven't forgotten her message about the key to longevity. She said: "I get so tired of people bemoaning the fact that they're turning 80 or 85; you'd think it was the end of the world, for heaven's sakes. I don't think so! Just imagine what it feels like to turn 105."

Then the interviewer asked, "So what do you think is the key to longevity and a spirit of vitality?" This centenarian replied, "The real key is to always have

a new adventure in sight—something new to look towards. This year at 105, I'll be flying over the Grand Canyon—something I've never done before. But I'm looking forward to it!"

I loved the energy and vision that I heard in her voice. It's also excellent advice to a congregation like ours which turns 114 this year: Always have a new adventure in sight! And St. Andrew's does indeed have a new adventure in sight: Growing. LIFE. Together. With God. A couple of Sundays ago in worship we got a vivid picture of what this new adventure looks like. One of our seniors, Thelma Wagner, worked with Rev. Jared and our young children to plant amaryllis bulbs. This inter-generational venture is already sprouting results—which you'll see in worship every week this month. By Annual Congregational Meeting Sunday (Feb. 23rd) there may even be some bright fresh blooms. There's no telling what beautiful new things are in store for St. Andrew's as we embark on this new adventure of Growing. LIFE. Together. With God.

The discernment of a new vision for ministry represented a significant amount of our focus during 2019. Early in the year the ReVision and Renewal Task Force was already discerning plans for our Fall ReVisioning Process. Over the summer, our ministers took Silent Retreats, and weekly Prayer Groups began meeting as we prepared to listen for God's voice and leading. In October, elders met weekly for study and prayer, while in worship we learned and experienced more of the church's ancient practice of prayerfully discerning God's will together. Through two Congregational Discernment Events and an Elder's Discernment Retreat we distinctly heard that Growing. LIFE. Together. With God. is our Vision for Ministry. It's our new God-given adventure!

As one observant congregation member responded, "But that's just who we are." Exactly. This is indeed our DNA as a congregation. Many of you could give testimony to how St. Andrew's has grown "the LIFE that's really LIFE" (1 Tim. 6:19) in you and in those you love. It is who we are and it's what God wants to do more of through us for the good of our city and world. At a time when economic fortunes seem stuck and when weekly we hear of new provincial or city budget cuts, God wants us to continue to focus on the hope of Growing. LIFE. Together. With God. here in Calgary. Like resilient farmers, when one season proves less productive, we don't stop planting, instead we step out in faith to experiment more shrewdly with new soil inputs, innovative irrigation, or fresh seed types, and with ongoing prayer.

In 2020 we'll begin to develop a new growth strategy for this new Vision for ministry at St. Andrew's. In April our beloved Rev. Jan Hazlett (who has been on extended health leave) will retire. During 2020, to grow our capacity for ministry in the areas of Pastoral Care, Discipleship / Spiritual Formation and our Engagement of New Folk, we will begin the search for a new full-time minister for this position. Please pray with us as we seek God's lead and step out in faith to grow new LIFE together for the good of our city and our world. A new adventure awaits!

... and there's no telling what beautiful new things are in store for St. Andrew's.

And I get to see her discovering With God when we forget to pray before a meal, and she reaches out her hands waiting for us to take them and say grace with her.

Growing. Life. Together. With God isn't just a vision for ministry. It's a vision for St. Andrew's. It's a vision for a faith family discovering what it means to be children of God. It's a vision that invites us to thrive, to discover who God has knit us together to become and what God has uniquely equipped us to do.

Here is my core conviction; I think God has given us this vision because it is the vision that we deserve. For two decades St. Andrew's has been in numeric decline – looking for clearly marked pathways, and now God has given us a flashlight. As the prophet Isaiah reminds us, the people walking in darkness have seen a great light. This vision tells me four things God thinks about St. Andrew's: it deserves to grow, it deserves to feel alive, it deserves to be whole, and it deserves to experience the weight of God's glory.

As I look back on the last year of ministry, I have seen this vision manifest in the life of St. Andrew's so many times, I can't count ... many of which you can read in this Annual Report. What I love most about it though, is that I have the privilege to lead into this vision with a particular focus on TheCreek. TheCreek extends our ministry to people who will never experience St. Andrew's in a conventional way, the way I've been blessed to experience it over the past five years. TheCreek is one of a number of ministries where our vision will come into full sight.

Be blessed in your growth, be blessed in your life, be blessed in your togetherness and be blessed with your God.


Linda Haines Ministry Resource & Accountability

Formerly known as the **Stewardship Team**, part of the overall Stewardship, Planning and Finance Committee, the team's name was changed in 2019 to Stewards by Design following St. Andrew's participation in the national Stewards by Design Conference hosted by the PCC in Ontario in early May.

The five individuals who represented our congregation at the conference were Dr. Tim, Elaine Cantlon, Cathy Millar, David Platt and Stephanie Werle. The conference presenter was Dr. Kennon Callahan and his book Twelve Keys to an Effective Church formed the basis of his presentations.

The Stewards by Design program helps congregations discover how to nurture faith and generosity to grow ministry. We understand that Stewardship is not just about financial matters; it is very much a spiritual matter concerned with all aspects of life. It was an exciting time and an excellent opportunity to share stories and ideas with other Presbyterian churches from coast to coast. While there was a lot to process, with Dr. Tim's guidance we did manage to come up with a list of goals and we are now developing a stewardship plan to meet the needs of St. Andrew's.

On Sunday, September 29, Stewards by Design hosted a Planned Giving presentation with Jim MacDonald, Development Manager, Stewardship and Planned Giving for the PCC. Lunch was provided for about 15 people. Jim had very helpful advice and provided us with a variety of informative brochures on planned giving. Additional brochures are available at the Giving Centre in the foyer for anyone who might be interested.

In 2019 we decided to put a greater focus on GIVING through the creation of The Giving Centre, where information about the various giving options can be found. This has also helped to highlight the option of electronic giving via credit card, which more people are now using.

During November and early December the team highlighted all that this congregation and its Ministry means to so many people, those inside and those outside the walls of St. Andrew's. The goal was to encourage members to use the various tools available to them to give so that we could all come together and end the year on a financial high note! With God's help we succeeded!!! 2019 Results

God is good, God is generous, God loves St. Andrews!

We had a miraculous (and probably unprecedented) level of donations in December 2019 which allowed us to finish 2019 on a very positive note. A few highlights include:

- In December, the congregation very generously donated \$120,000 to St. Andrew's. \$73,177.33 went toward the mission and ministry of St. Andrew's. The remainder went to support our various charitable initiatives, facilities and other items which are not part of our operating expenses.
- Our teams were very busy in 2019, providing a number of successful opportunities for the congregation and wider community. The Aboriginal Awareness Day, ReVision task force, youth activities, Claire House and Alpha are just a few of the ways Christ used us to impact the lives of our congregation and share His love.
- Many people used their gifts to keep our building running smoothly, going the extra step to ensure that all who came here felt welcomed and comfortable and wanted.

2020 Plan

Our 2020 Plan was approved by Session on January 25th and will be presented at the Annual Congregational Meeting on February 23rd, 2020 for the congregation's approval.

Goals and Objectives for 2020

- 1. In conjunction with the Renewal process, ensure that updated policies, procedures and financial authorities are in place.
- 2. Review and update our current software to ensure that best practices continue in financial reporting, treasury, cash management and congregational engagement. (Designated funding is already in place.)
- 3. In conjunction with the Treasurer, perform a full review of our 2019 spending and make any improvements and corrections as are necessary for 2020.
- 4. Inform the congregation on a quarterly basis as to the financial health of St. Andrew's and answer any questions.





Judie Coleman Hospital Visiting Ministry

The mandate of our Hospital Visitors' Ministry is to provide spiritual care for the people of St. Andrew's Church who are being treated in Calgary hospitals. Our visitors are part of the spiritual care organization of the Calgary hospitals and are required to complete the hospital training program. They are admitted into their volunteer care program and comply with those program regulations. The cost of training is covered by St. Andrew's. If you would like to be part of the Hospital Visiting Ministry, first let our Pastoral Care Coordinator know, and you will be guided through the steps.

Our volunteers try to visit anyone who has registered as Presbyterian, but especially to visit those from St. Andrew's. To make timely visits, we need to be aware of people being admitted to the hospital, so it is helpful if the office or the ministers are informed. During the year we had three lay hospital visitors. Arlene Young and Linda Burton-Chalmers visited at Rockyview, and Jayne Martin visited at the South Health Campus. Elizabeth Kangong joined our team in December and will visit at the Foothills and at Peter Lougheed. We are thankful for their dedication to this ministry.

Lorie Nielsen Prayer Chain Ministry

Occasionally the person receiving prayer is not aware of it. As an example, we have prayed for a young woman holding a sign and begging by the side of the road. God always knows who we mean.

STEPHEN MINISTRY:























ALPHA:
