
# Welcome to Metropolitan United Church



For the 11:00 a.m. service today, **The Rev. Alan Hall** is calling us to remember who we are: a church firmly grounded in scripture and theology. His sermon is entitled "We Believe in God". The Rev. Alan Hall serves at the General Council as the Executive Officer for Ministry and Employment (VP HR) with responsibility for the credentialing, oversight, and discipline of ministry personnel as well as being the senior staff officer for the pension and benefits plans of the denomination. Prior to this he served in pastoral ministry for twenty-six years.

We are saddened to learn about the death of our Carillonneur Emeritus, **James (Bud) Slater** on Sunday, February 17. In 1954 James, on the advice of Bob Donnell, approached Leland Richardson at the University of Toronto's carillon and asked for carillon lessons but was referred to Stanley James, the Carillonneur at Metropolitan United Church in Toronto. Mr. James was most receptive and started teaching James carillon fundamentals on the 23 bells that the Metropolitan had at the time. In 1957, James was appointed Assistant Carillonneur at Metropolitan and held that position until 1962 when he and the incumbent, Stan James, exchanged duties. James Slater retired in 1997 and was honoured by

Metropolitan Church with the title "Carillonneur Emeritus" in recognition of his 35 years of service.
