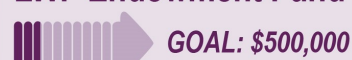

# He Knows My Name

Sometimes it's hard to remember another person's name. Maybe it's because it has been a long time since the last time we saw that person. Or maybe we're seeing that person in an unfamiliar setting. Or it might be because we just have a hard time remembering names, period. And even though, some would say I have a pretty good memory, I still find myself struggling to remember names of people I have met before.

There are gimmicks to remembering names. We might connect a name to a person due to a physical feature or some idiosyncrasy that is noticed. Just wondering (tongue in cheek) if that's how God remembers our names, since Psalm 139 indicates that God knows us inside out. I might then be known as the person who wanders around when he preaches! However, in reality, God knows us by name, even as God knows us inside out.

When our daughters were younger, occasionally I would have them sing in church with me while playing simple chords on a guitar. One of the songs was "Psalm 49." *I will never forget you, my people; I have carved you on the palm of my hand. I will never forget you, I will not leave you orphaned; I will never forget my own.*"

A small banner that hangs on the front wall of our sanctuary has these words: **Today God Spoke My Name.** It's usually put there when we celebrate a baptism. Just a couple of weeks ago, we saw it again when Adam Enokson, Abby Storrow, Evan Thiessen, Moira Fielden and Abby Prangnell affirmed their baptisms and made deeper commitments to following Jesus. I'm not so sure that this banner should only be up when there is a baptism or affirmation of baptism. We just might leave it up as a reminder, each time we worship, of our own baptisms, of our call to "walk wet" day by day, of the consistent, persistent presence of our God who knows our name.



During our worship on Affirmation of Baptism (aka Confirmation) Sunday, the Praise Team sang the song, "He Knows My Name": *He knows my name, He knows my every thought; He sees each tear that falls, And He hears me when I call.*"

Perhaps, as we begin each day, we might reflect on the "blessed assurance" that the One who knows our name, will be the One who is with us "step by step."

The smell of fresh rubber pierces through my allergen plugged sinuses as I wait for another camp vehicle to get a new set of tires and be serviced for the season. Registrations are coming in and horses hooves are starting to get trimmed. Elk trodden fences are slowly being picked up and spliced back together. A bundle of fence posts lay at the camp gate waiting to be pounded into the ground where other posts have decided to retire. Broken tail-light wires are being spliced on horse trailers to make our intentions clear on the road, and the list goes on. Preparation is a big part of camp and something we can all relate to. I'm sure many of you spent the last couple of months preparing seeding equipment, planting seedlings for a garden, studying for final exams, or even just changing your car tires from winter over to summer tires. Preparation is part of life and a rich undertone to spring.

The theme I have chosen to use for camp this summer is the Armor of God from Ephesians 6. One thing that struck me about this passage as I was reading it recently was the preparatory nature of the passage. I believe that one of the lessons that God is speaking to us through this passage is that we, as followers of Jesus, need to prepare. Our preparation as Christians isn't a seasonal task that we complete through confirmation class or a year or two at bible school. Our preparation needs to be a daily task. Ephesians 6 tells us that we are daily in a battle against spiritual forces and the schemes of the devil. We need to take time each morning to pray truth, righteousness, faith, peace, salvation, and the word of God onto ourselves and those who we love to prepare ourselves for this battlefield. When we pray the armor upon ourselves it re-aligns our worldview and general outlook. Day to day tasks take on new meaning and a greater sense of purpose. With truth, righteousness, faith, peace, salvation, and the word of God laded upon us the physical irritants of this world have less impact on us and less power to change our disposition. I believe that by praying the armor of God upon ourselves we will see powerful changes in our lives; however, those changes start small and usually in a simple way. So rather than getting angry over your next flat tire, think of it as a divine opportunity to check your shock absorbers and brake pads. Overcoming those small obstacles through the power of God's armor is excellent preparation for the bigger battles that we will fight in the future.

As we continue to prepare for another summer at Wilderness Ranch I would like to ask you to pray that God would fill our camps this summer as the last several summers we have been below capacity. With this being said, the majority of our first time campers come to Wilderness Ranch because they heard about us through someone who attended or worked at camp. So keep up the good work camp alumni! We have been promoting camp at a few different venues this year. Pray that God would use these opportunities to bring kids to camp. More importantly, pray that God would draw his people back to himself through camp.

Please join us for our 50th anniversary on the July long weekend. Fifty years is an incredible milestone and we are excited to be a part of this celebration. Wilderness Ranch has been a special part of my life and I'm sure it has been a special piece of your life story as well. Come to the fiftieth and share your stories from camp. I would love to hear them and get the opportunity to meet you face to face.

# “Stop Famine” Appeal—Matching Grant

More than 20 million people in South Sudan, Yemen, Somalia and Nigeria are facing a food crisis and in need of urgent humanitarian aid. In addition, the countries of Ethiopia, Kenya, Uganda, Niger, Chad and Cameroon, are facing their own hunger crises or are feeling the effects from their neighbours.

The **Evangelical Lutheran Church in Canada (ELCIC)**, through its partnership with **Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR)**, calls on its members to respond through prayer and financial support to help meet the needs of drought-affected people through the promotion of climate resilient food production. In Ethiopia, CLWR is supporting small-scale farmers and pastoralists by constructing irrigation systems to improve food production. ## Financials

### Get on PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) at LCOS

Did you know that you may give to LCOS via pre-authorized remittance one time per month from your bank or credit union chequing account? This program is like any other pre-authorized debit program and is called the PAR (Pre-Authorized Remittance) program. Debits will be drawn from accounts on the 20th of each month. Whenever the 20th falls on a weekend or holiday, the debits will be drawn on the first business day following the 20th. Donations via the PAR program will be recorded on quarterly statements and year-end tax receipts along with all other giving.

#### **Amounts from PAR can be directed to:**

- 1) The LCOS general budget
- 2) Canadian Lutheran World Relief (CLWR)
- 3) Capital Maintenance

You can give additional amounts and to other purposes via your regular donation envelopes.

The minimum amount to give via this program is a total of \$50.00 per month.

You can sign up, make banking or donation amount changes, or withdraw from the program at any time. These changes will be effective the month following the submission of the change. Forms are available to process these changes. The program is administered by the Financial Secretary. Authorization forms are available in the Place of Welcome.
