Officiant

The Officiant asks the candidate when presented:

Do you desire to be baptized?

Candidate I do.

Then the Officiant asks the following questions of the presenters & candidate

Officiant Do you renounce Satan

and all the spiritual forces of wickedness that rebel against God?

Answer I renounce them.

Officiant Do you renounce the evil powers of this world

which corrupt and destroy the creatures of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Officiant Do you renounce all sinful desires that draw you from the love of God?

Answer I renounce them.

Officiant Do you turn to Jesus Christ and accept him as your Saviour?

Answer

Officiant Do you put your whole trust in his grace and love?

Answer I do.

Officiant Do you promise to obey him as your Lord?

Answer I do. After the candidate has been presented, the Officiant addresses the congregation:

Will you who witness these vows do all in your power

to support Margaret in her life in Christ?

The Celebration of Baptism

Thanksgiving over the Water

The Officiant blesses the water:

Officiant The Lord be with you All And also with you.

Officiant Let us give thanks to the Lord our God.

All It is right to give our thanks and praise.

Officiant We give you thanks, almighty God and Father,

for by the gift of water you nourish and sustain all living things.

All Blessed be God for ever.

Officiant We give you thanks that through the waters of the Red Sea,

you led your people out of slavery to freedom in the promised land.

All Blessed be God for ever.

Officiant We give you thanks for sending your Son Jesus.

For us he was baptized by John in the river Jordan. For us he was anointed as Christ by your Holy Spirit.

For us he suffered the baptism of his own death and resurrection,

setting us free from the bondage of sin and death,

and opening to us the joy and freedom of everlasting life.

All Blessed be God for ever.

Officiant We give you thanks for your Holy Spirit who teaches us and leads us into all truth,

filling us with his gifts so that we might proclaim the gospel to all nations

and serve you as a royal priesthood.

All Blessed be God for ever.

Officiant We give you thanks for you have called Margaret

to new life through the waters of baptism.

Now sanctify this water, that your servants who are washed in it may be made one with Christ in his death and resurrection,

to be cleansed and delivered from all sin. Anoint them with your Holy Spirit

and bring them to new birth in the family of your Church, that they may become inheritors of your glorious kingdom.

We give you praise and honour

and worship through your Son Jesus Christ our Lord, in the unity of the Holy Spirit, now and for ever.

All Blessed are you, our strength and song, and our salvation.

Officiant Let us join with those who are committing themselves to Christ

and renew our own baptismal covenant.

The Baptismal Covenant

Officiant Do you believe in God the Father?

All I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth.

Officiant Do you believe in Jesus Christ, the Son of God?

All I believe in Jesus Christ, his only Son, our Lord.

He was conceived by the power of the Holy Spirit and born of the Virgin Mary.

He suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried.

He descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again.

He ascended into heaven, and is seated at the right hand of the Father.

He will come again to judge the living and the dead.

Officiant Do you believe in God the Holy Spirit?

All I believe in God the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic Church,

the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Officiant Will you continue in the apostles' teaching and fellowship,

in the breaking of bread, and in the prayers?

All I will, with God's help.

Officiant Will you persevere in resisting evil and,

whenever you fall into sin, repent and return to the Lord?

All I will, with God's help.

Officiant Will you proclaim by word and example the good news of God in Christ?

All I will, with God's help.

Officiant Will you seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving your neighbour as yourself?

All I will, with God's help.

Officiant Will you strive for justice and peace among all people,

and respect the dignity of every human being?

All I will, with God's help.

Officiant Will you strive to safeguard the integrity of God's creation,

and respect, sustain and renew the life of the Earth?

All I will, with God's help.

The Baptism

The candidate is presented to the Officiant.

Officiant Margaret, I baptize you in the name of the Father,

and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit.

All Amen.

Using chrism, the Officiant makes the sign of the cross on the forehead, saying:

I sign you with the cross, and mark you as Christ's own for ever.

The Officiant prays over the newly baptized, saying:

Heavenly Father,

we thank you that by water and the Holy Spirit

you have bestowed upon this your servant the forgiveness of sin,

and have raised her to the new life of grace. Sustain her, O Lord, in your Holy Spirit. Give her an inquiring and a discerning heart,

the courage to will and to persevere, a spirit to know and to love you,

and the gift of joy and wonder in all your works.

All Amen.

The Giving of the Light

One of the ministers then gives to the newly baptized a lighted candle, saying:

Receive the light of Christ,

to show that you have passed from darkness to light.

When the newly baptized has received a candle, the people say:

All Let your light so shine before others

that they may see your good works and glorify your Father in heaven.

Officiant Let us welcome the newly baptized.

All We receive you into the household of God.

Confess the faith of Christ crucified,

proclaim his resurrection,

and share with us in his eternal priesthood.

The Peace

Presider May the peace of the Lord be always with you.

All And also with you.

We welcome Margaret Lu baptized today into the community of the risen Christ.
