INTRODUCTION: LENT AND EASTER

We have endeavored to adjust our life rhythms to those of the Church calendar to ensure proper emphasis is placed on the major events of Jesus' life on earth. In the season of Lent, we are invited to retreat into the wilderness with Jesus. Just as He consecrated 40 days for fasting and prayer in the desert following His baptism, we enter a 40 day period of consecration leading into the celebration of Easter. You may notice that the season of Lent is slightly more than 40 days. This is because every Sunday is a celebration and commemoration of Christ's resurrection, a day for feasting rather than fasting.

The season of Lent begins with **Ash Wednesday** and ends on **Holy Saturday**. Ash Wednesday is a solemn day when we are reminded of our sinfulness and mortality, and we are invited to turn our eyes to the hope we have in Christ. A sign of the cross is marked with ashes upon our heads as a vivid reminder of sacrifice, and a reminder that we are dust "and to dust we shall return". In this symbol of penance, we are invited to develop a spirit of humility. After receiving the ashen mark of the cross, we move to Eucharist, knowing that death does not have the final word; that God is most gracious and merciful to those who call upon Him with repentant hearts.

From the earliest days of the church, the season of Lent has been a preparatory time when the faithful have dedicated themselves anew, and converts are instructed in the faith and prepared for baptism. Many people choose to fast during this season. This is not meant so much to be a focus on the sorrow of Christ's death as much as an expression of sorrow over the *cause* of His death: our sin. So the season of Lent is a season of dying, giving up, emptying and clearing out. We live in this space in-between ashes and redemption; remembering our darkness that is turned to glorious light through the work of the cross.

The season of Lent concludes with **Holy Week** or **Passion Week**, beginning with **Palm Sunday**. On Palm Sunday, Jesus triumphantly rode into Jerusalem; cheered on by a multitude of people who were full of expectation for a Messiah-Deliverer. Yet it is a bittersweet festival considering that only days later many of these same people would be calling for the crucifixion of Jesus, in exchange for the life of the scoundrel Barabbas. It is a clear reminder of our own weakness and the sinfulness that can cause us to reject Christ.

Maundy Thursday is an incredibly complex and profoundly meaningful remembrance of Jesus' final moments with His disciples before being condemned to die a sinner's death. In this one evening we see Him as the self-offered victim of sacrifice paralleled with the Last Supper of Passover. We see

the worth that God ascribes to humility of service encapsulated in Jesus washing the feet of His disciples. And we grasp, with adoration and esteem, the sacrificial nature of Christ's agony – how we can share in His sufferings, similarly to how His disciples joined Him at the Mount of Olives as He poured out His soul in prayer "unto death", drinking of the cup of sorrows.

On **Good Friday** we remember the ultimate sacrifice, the day that the spotless Lamb of God, Jesus Christ, willingly gave himself up as an offering, to be crucified –stricken with the pain and sin of humanity – taking all of our brokenness upon himself and killing it on the cross.

After a long Saturday, all anticipation and longing; hope and consecration crescendos in the glorious and triumphant celebration of Christ's resurrection! **Easter Sunday** is the high point of the Christian year when we celebrate the central mystery of Christ: His death on the cross and His triumphant resurrection. It's a time of joyous reflection, the celebration of Christus Victor, the One who conquered sin and death, who redeems us unto Himself, and who will rule and rein over a Kingdom with no end!

Within the Easter season is also contained the short season of the **Ascension**. In this season we celebrate the exaltation of Christ to the right hand of the Father in heaven. Christ not only offered salvation to our souls, but in this final act of redemption — Jesus' work on earth is completed and we are assured of a glorious future whereby all of creation is invited to the path of restoration, fulfilling the prayer and promise of "Thy Kingdom come, Thy will be done, on earth as it is in heaven!"

The Easter season ends with **Pentecost Sunday**, a day when we celebrate the "birth of the Christian Church"; the day when the Holy Spirit came upon the Apostles and all of the faithful gathered in prayer in the upper room and empowered them to fulfill Christ's mission on earth. It is the Presence of the Holy Spirit with the People of God that has characterized them from that day to this. So on this day, we celebrate these two important realities: the Holy Spirit and the Church.

JOURNEYING THROUGH LENT AS FAMILIES

As we fast during the season of Lent, we give up something to make space for Jesus, for the Word, prayer or time worshipping Him. What we take away or fast from, we replace with Jesus. We often think of fasting food or types of food, but there are other practical ways you can fast. For example, where you would have spent time watching TV, you could instead spend that time praying and reading the Word.

Fasting together as a family can be beneficial, and a great opportunity to journey through the season of Lent together. You can support each other in your fast, whilst talking to your kids about the impact the fast is having on their hearts. It's a spiritual discipline meant to grow a relationship with Jesus and reflect on the sacrifices Jesus endured for us. This is a beautiful time to sit as a family, process our hearts, and talk about sacrifice, thankfulness, and repentance together. Fasting for kids might look like no TV, no video games, no candy or desserts. You can ask them what they feel the Lord wanting them to give up to make more time and space for Him.

MONTHLY PSALM SCHEDULE

Pray through the Psalm in the table below that corresponds to the day of the week, and spend a few moments in conversation with the Scriptures – taking to prayer the things that the Lord is highlighting to you through his word.

CLOSING PRAYER

Focus on:

- Praying for the gift of repentance in your home, church and community
- Praying that your heart would be softened towards the conviction of the Holy Spirit
- Praying for a mindfulness of God's presence and blessings in your life

EVENING PRAYER

All merciful God and Lord, give us a hunger and thirst for you, that this holy season would be a time of grace. May we see Christ clearly so that we might come before Him in humble adoration.
