

Covid-19 Operational Plan

We have an Operational Plan for our church and hall. Expect things to be different when you come to worship, including screening, your temperature will be taken, hand sanitizing, physical distancing, following provincial guidelines. Effective October 9 wearing of masks is mandatory in all indoor public places in our province. The officiant and the reader are not required to wear a mask at the front of the church, as long as 4-meters distance from the congregation is maintained.

We are six months behind in our Shared Ministry remittances to the Diocese. While we are thankful that we did not have to tap into the Bank Line of Credit during the summer months, our Sept. 2020 income was down 58% over Sept. 2019. Given our currently financial position, the vestry determined that we are unable to rehire our organist at this time. If our cash flow improves, we can review our position. We would love to have our beloved organist back with us!!

Remembrance Sunday, Nov. 8, 10:30 am

Given the COVID situation, the Woodstock Veteran's Week committee has decided that a combined church parade for veterans would not be practical due to distancing, masks etc. for our groups. The local Ministerial has agreed that each church facility will host its own Remembrance observance on Sunday, November 8, inviting all men and women who have served in the military to wear their medals/decorations.

If you belong to an association, Legion, ANAVETS, Peacekeeper etc. you are invited to wear your uniform.

Those who have deceased relatives who served, uncles, aunts, parent, grandparent, are encouraged to bring the medals of that person to honour their memory.

This approach will allow each church to remember and honour those who served, families will still be able to be in their 'bubble' and comfort zone. Also, those attending will be able to see the people that have served that otherwise they would not have known.

The objective is to honour and remember while minimizing movement, maintaining distance, and following protocols.

It has also been decided to have a scaled-back ceremony at the War Memorial on Remembrance Day. Town Officials are meeting with the Veteran's Week Committee to discuss the details. More info will be forthcoming.
