John 14:27-31 (CSB)

JESUS'S GIFT OF PEACE

27 "Peace I leave with you. My peace I give to you. I do not give to you as the world gives. Don't let your heart be troubled or fearful. 28 You have heard me tell you, 'I am going away and I am coming to you.' If you loved me, you would rejoice that I am going to the Father, because the Father is greater than I. 29 I have told you now before it happens so that when it does happen you may believe. 30 I will not talk with you much longer, because the ruler of the world is coming. He has no power over me. 31 On the contrary, so that the world may know that I love the Father, I do as the Father commanded me.


DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1) How would you describe the peace "as the world gives"? (v27).
- 2) In what ways do you find yourself drawn to this kind of peace today?
- 3) How is the peace Jesus offers different to worldly peace?
- 4) As you look back over 2020, to what extent have you experienced God's peace this year?
- 5) Why should the disciples have rejoiced knowing Jesus was leaving them? Why is this principle important for our own lives?
- 6) What did Jesus mean when he said the "Father is greater than I"?
- 7) What is the significance of Jesus going to the cross willingly?
- 8) Reflecting on Christ's defeat of Satan, how does this bring you comfort and peace personally this week?

DISCIPLESHIP DIGEST

As we continue our series on owning our input, I want to recommend a children's series to you. It's called "What's in the Bible". Made by the same people who created the original Veggie Tales series, 'What's in the Bible' aims to give children as young as 3 a solid understanding of scripture. Each episode of about 30 minutes explores a book of the Bible, explains how that book fits into the big picture story of scripture, and deals with any issues arising from that book. We have been using this series as our evening devotions with our kids, and it has both engaged and informed them.



What I particularly like about this series is that it doesn't shy away from the difficult topics within scripture, and they even explain Song of Songs in a way that is age appropriate for children! In fact, I recommend this series to anyone, whether they have children or not. This series will help anyone who watches it see how the Bible fits together, how it all culminates in Jesus, and what this then means for you and me today. I really cannot recommend this series enough!

The ANGEL TREE

As a volunteer of Prison Fellowship I would like to introduce you to the program **The Angel Tree.**

This program is run by Prison Fellowship which gives gifts to children between the ages of 0-15 of prisoners at Christmas. Normally church members would purchase a gift, however because of COVID restrictions this is not possible and therefore we would like to ask you for a monetary donation.



I am coordinating this program with the diaconate and together we will purchase gifts from the money received on your behalf, and post off the gifts.

Helping one child is simple. All you need to do is make an offering of \$30.00 for a gift, plus \$12-18 for postage. You can deposit this money into the Diaconate Bank Account noting the deposit is for the Angel Tree by the 15th November 2020.

The giving of a gift is a blessing for these children who feel excluded from normal family life because they have a parent in prison. Through receiving a gift, both the children and the prisoners feel that someone cares for them, and in the past this giving has changed their lives.





- Please pray for Help a Child mission as we are at a crossroad and need to make some wise decisions as to the way forward.
- Please continue to pray for our nation as our governments try to steer us through the economic fallout of the corona virus. Pray that the people of our nation will humble themselves before God and seek his forgiveness for our sins and turn to the one who has each one of us in his hands.

Please pray for our brothers and sisters in Nigeria. Nigeria is facing a serious threat from Islamic terrorist groups. Militant Muslims are waging an insurgency to overthrow the government and rid the country of Christians. After losing ground in Syria and Iraq, the US Special Operations Command in Africa is warning that Al Qaeda, ISIS, and other Islamic terror groups are now trying to take over parts of the continent's most populous nation. Major General Anderson says Muslim terrorists have set their sights on Nigeria's southern and northwest regions "So we are now sharing intelligence which is absolutely vital to provide the government of Nigeria with understanding of what these terrorists are doing," Anderson said during a recent press conference. Their goal: eventually turn Nigeria into a Muslim country and force Christians, who make up half the country's population, to either leave or convert to Islam.

"Christians are the eye of the target and they are coming after them," warned Dede Laugesen with Save the Persecuted Christians. The numbers are staggering. Leading human rights groups say what's going on in Nigeria is a genocide. "Over the last 20 years, there have been massive attacks against Christians," Jeff King, president of International Christian Concern (ICC) said. "50 to 70 thousand have been murdered." For years, the main terror group was Boko Haram, which seeks to overthrow the government and create an Islamic state. "They go after Christians and moderate Muslims, they push a hard-line Muslim agenda and it is their intention to establish a caliphate and to rid all of Nigeria and West Africa of any Western influence whatsoever," Laugesen said. Now, there's a new actor on the scene.

In Nigeria's "Middle Belt" region, where the Muslim North meets the Christian South a terror group made up of Muslim Fulani herders are killing thousands of Christians. More than 1,400 Christians were hacked to death in just the first seven months of 2020 by Fulani herders. "Unfortunately, the secular media are quiet often biased and try to present this as a tribal conflict rather than religious," said Petr Jasek, who is author of the book, Imprisoned With ISIS: Faith in the Face of Evil. Nigeria's Muslim president has so far done very little to stop the bloodshed. His police and army are also mostly Muslims. "The attackers are never captured, they are not prosecuted, the security services respond very slowly, a full day can go on with attacks happening and no security shows up and frequently the government officials will provide cover," explained Laugesen.

Helpless and vulnerable to almost daily attacks, leading Catholic bishops are urging Nigerian Christians to defend themselves. Human rights groups are asking the White House to appoint a special envoy to end the persecution of Nigerian Christians. "Unless the world takes note and applies sanctions and visa bans on the officials who are responsible for not reigning in the terror, then Nigeria will continue to be a bloodbath," Laugesen warned. Meanwhile, King's group is helping more than 3,000 Christians who have lost their businesses, homes, farms, or land to Boko Haram and Fulani militant attacks. ICC has created communal farms to give victims the opportunity to rebuild their lives. "When they get back to work, the family is fed, they have a future, the kids can go back to school," King told CBN News. "It's a restoration of hope and means a lot to them."
