

Gospel of Luke Study Questions Read Chap 1:57-80

- When Elizabeth gave birth, news spread of the great mercy the Lord had shown to her and her neighbors and relatives shared her joy. Take some time to share about the moments in your life when God has shown great mercy to you and your family. Encourage each other with these stories.
- The name John means "the Lord is merciful". How do we see God's mercy in the life of Zechariah and Elizabeth?
- As parents who have raised children or watched other families raise their kids, what challenges would you face raising a future prophet of God? How would this impact your family?
- How did the Lord use Zechariah's silence to reach other people in the community and bring glory to His name? Have you ever experienced a hardship in your life that at the time you felt was a punishment from God that later resulted in God receiving praise?
- Read verses 68-79. How important was John's role as a prophet preparing the way for Jesus? Which verses stand out to you the most and what do we learn about God's plan of salvation for His people through this passage?
- Why would John choose to live in the wilderness until the beginning of his ministry of baptism?
- Does examining the story of Zechariah, Elizabeth and John change the way you read and understand the Christmas story of Christ's birth? Would John's birth and the visit with Elizabeth have prepared Mary for the birth of her baby? What expectations might Mary have had?
