Ephesians 6:5-9 "Together in Work"

Paul uses the civic term "citizens" (Eph. 2:19) to describe Christians, rather than the religious term "worshippers." In fact, Ephesians gives virtually no instructions about what the church should do when it gathers, but several instructions about how its mem-bers should work.

In the ESV the word "work" is used 377 times in the Old Testament, and 195 times in the New Testament.
