### PASTOR ED'S EPISTLE

Change is coming!! How do I know? Two things.

**First**, Punxsutawney Phil did not see his shadow on February 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2020 so he is predicting that spring will come early this year.

**Second,** we celebrate Easter on April 12<sup>th</sup> and that is the day we celebrate not only Jesus resurrection from the dead but our resurrection to new life. God is working His resurrection power in each and every one of us as Christ followers in order to glorify Himself and to make us into the image of His Son Jesus Christ.

Change comes to us when we begin by confessing our sin. Confessing is agreeing with God about our sin and asking Him to forgive our sin. Then, God grants to us the gift of repentance. Repentance is being remorseful for offending God by our disobedience to Him and His commands and doing something about it. Turning away from our sin and turning to the Spirit to fill us and take control of our lives as we obey God and His Word.

Change comes when we realize we are dead to sin. Romans 6: 5-11 tell us

"5 For if we have been united with him in a death like his, we shall certainly be united with him in a resurrection like his. 6 We know that our old self was crucified with him in order that the body of sin might be brought to nothing, so that we would no longer be enslaved to sin. 7 For one who has died has been set free from sin. 8 Now if we have died with Christ, we believe that we will also live with him. 9 We know that Christ, being raised from the dead, will never die again; death no longer has dominion over him. 10 For the death he died he died to sin, once for all, but the life he lives he lives to God. 11 So you also must consider yourselves dead to sin and alive to God in Christ Jesus."

We must identify with Christ in His death. As our substitute, He took on Himself the penalty of all of our sins and when He cried out "It is Finished", our sin was dealt with as far as God is concerned. We are no longer slaves to sin!! It no longer holds power over us unless we allow it. We can say no to sin and allow change to occur by building new habits into our lives if we will see ourselves on that cross with Jesus and letting sin die in our lives. Boy, that is so hard to do. Easy to see but hard to do.

We struggle with temptation when it comes because many times it feels so good and our flesh wants to participate in it. But for our long term (eternal) good and for our good on this earth, it is good to die to ourselves.

#### Galatians 2:20

"I have been crucified with Christ. It is no longer I who live, but Christ who lives in me. And the life I now live in the flesh I live by faith in the Son of God, who loved me and gave himself for me."

The great news is that we do not lose our identity when we are in Christ!! Hinduism, Buddhism, Jainism and other religions say when they die, they are absorbed into Brahma or another god but we will have our identity forever in eternity.

Why is that significant? Because God took special care in making you and I who we are and our identity is found in our position with Christ. We are all unique and have a very special purpose and work in God's Kingdom. Don't ever forget that and don't ever think your life is not valuable. We are much more valuable than we could ever imagine. He paid for our lives with the precious blood of Jesus. He was willing to die for us so that we could be holy and be in heaven with Him somedeay!!

#### **ELDER REPORTS**

#### **Elder Report for January and February**

The elders are Aaron Barfels, Mike Fendley, Dale Von Thun, and Pastor Ed Hedding.

The elders met on Jan. 13<sup>th</sup>, 27<sup>th</sup> and Feb. 10<sup>th</sup> of 2020.

The elders take time to pray for the needs of the church family and the elders needs at each meeting.

Follow up on our public relations endeavors to help with our online presence online:

Pastor Ed talked with two companies that specialize in removing negative web search results. These are expensive options. One would cost \$6000.

Hannah (Bland) DeAngelis suggests that we record positive testimonies from people regarding their relationship with PVBC. We will work on flooding the internet with testimonies and positive messages. 1 Peter 2:15 (ESV) For this is the will of God, that by doing good you should put to silence the ignorance of foolish people.

The elders believe the cost for professionally removing the negative search engine results was an unwise use of finances. We need to put our resources toward doing good.

A small group from the church met with the Immigration subcommittee of the One Human Family on January 21st at 5 pm. at the Catholic Dioceses office in Davenport by Assumption High School.

Kris Headington, Aaron Barfels and Pastor Ed from our church went and met with three representatives of One Human Family – Margie, Alta, and Loxy for an active listening discussion. It went very well after an hour meeting and the group plans to meet on Thursday – February 27<sup>th</sup> at 5 pm. for a time of dialogue concerning the immigration issue.

The elders decided to take on the project of installing a heater for Austin's office. Aaron Barfels will order the heater and thermostat. Mike Fendley said he can install it.

The elders plan to update the main church computer in Carrie Barfels' office because Windows 7 no longer will be serviced by Microsoft to avoid malware coming on to the computer. The library computer is too old to be upgraded so the new laptop that is used for scanning will be used at a time in the future as the way to access Power Church and for

use in the library keeping track of books.

Pastor Ed shared he wants an emphasis on prayer this year. He is forming a small group of people who will commit to praying for the church on a regular basis.

The elders set some measurable goals for 2020 and they were communicated to the church family on February 9<sup>th</sup>.

The Ministry Team Leaders meeting is scheduled for Saturday, January 25th.

We received positive feedback from the Chili Cook-Off Fellowship Lunch held January 12th.

The elders decided to go with the Peacemakers book for a sermon series and the three Adult Connect Groups will facilitate a discussion time after watching the videos from a similar book to what was mentioned above – Resolving Every Day Conflict. There will be eight sermons and they will coincide with the video series that will be shown and discussed in our Adult Groups. At some time in the future, the Junior / Senior High School class will watch and discuss the weekly topics.

We agreed to continue with Mike Fendley facilitating the elders' meetings and Aaron Barfels continuing to act as scribe for the next 6 months.

The Deacons (Chuck Gipson and Mario Sy) and Deaconesses (Carol Urda, Janice Fendley) joined the Elders at 5:30 on January 13th. Mike Myer was also in attendance because he oversees a Circle of Concern.

The primary topic was that of Benevolent fund usage and if there were guidelines that would help make decisions in this matter. The question is how much do we help a family.

Discussion was had by particular families in need and the ministry to the shut-ins that is ongoing.

Pastor Ed shared that a Remodeling Team has been put together and the following people willing to serve. The Remodel Team is currently comprised of: Tina Keppy, Denis Bland, Deanna Gipson, Gage Petersen, Austin Fink, Ed Hedding, Nancy Barnes and Danny Gatton.

We discussed the need to intentionally involve the younger generation in our church services and ministries. Here are some ways of doing that:

Record announcements and use younger people to deliver the announcements and record the announcements.

The younger people tend to read texts much more than email. Therefore, texting notifications is one example

of including them more in our information dissemination. We have a service that could do this very reasonably.

Pastor would like to start now trending to our younger generation as much as we can with decisions made in the next few years. He has been talking with some from the younger generation and it is apparent we need to be more up to date in how we approach things.

We discussed rebranding. Is it time to redo our logo and signage? Every ten years or so, most organizations and companies rebrand. We have a bid to do that. That will coincide with the Remodel Team project.

Ways to emphasize and equip people for Evangelism:

Give testimonies of people sharing their faith.

Bring in a person to share a skill or teach during a men's breakfast. Invite people who may be interested to intentionally introduce them to the gospel.

We need to keep track of first-time guests who come to XYZ event (men's breakfast, Ladies events, youth events, AWANA events, etc.)

Recent offering levels have been low. There was discussion as to why that may be and now preparations are under way for the new budget to be prepared for fiscal year 2020 - 2021 beginning on April  $1^{st}$  2020 and ending on March  $31^{st}$  2021. We know that several people are moving from the area in the Spring and that needs to be taken into account as we prepare the budget.

The elders discussed with Scott Lee, who is preparing our 2020 -2021 budget with the elders, as he gave us the first rough draft and there was much discussion and understanding how the budget is being built for this new fiscal year starting on April 1<sup>st</sup>. A second and final draft is forthcoming. The goal is to finalize the budget by March 2 or 9<sup>th</sup> and to get it out to the church family to look at and pray over as we prepare for our annual meeting on March 29<sup>th</sup> after the Connect Groups at 11:45 am.

The elders agreed to a request from Pastor Ed to reduce the QC Storm Hockey tickets to \$5 per person to make it more affordable for families to go to the game. The original cost was \$15 per ticket and the elders will cover the difference of each ticket out of elder discretionary funds.

Pastor Ed and Mike Fendley have been talking about giving

younger people more opportunities to be a part of the worship service and for leadership of the church. We want the younger generation to move toward taking over as time goes on. Ideas are being discussed and more discussion is coming in our March meetings.

Pastor Ed passed out goals for the church family on February 16<sup>th</sup>. These are measurable goals Pastor promised that would come from ideas of the leaders of the church. They were placed in the Sunday program and talked about in the service. Pastor will bring this up and remind people periodically through the course of calendar year 2020.

The goals are as follows

The elders dealt with some confidential issues concerning our church family as well.




