Jesus' life and death are a disruption to the social, political, and religious order that many are used to. But through all the disorder, his resurrection is an invitation to reorder our entire lives around the life of God!

Scripture: Mark 16:1-8, 9-20

Discussion Questions

1. In this week's teaching we talked about the process of transformation involving 3 stages: order - disorder - reorder. Where do you see 'disordering' in our world today? What emotions come with such a disruption in the way things are?
2. Read Mark 16:1-8. Peter is the one disciple mentioned by name. Why is that significant? Can you identify with Peter and his journey of following Jesus? In what ways? The ending is abrupt. If you were writing this story, what kinds of things would you include as an ending to the book, after these verses?
3. Have you seen the pattern of order - disorder - reorder in your life? How did you grow through these stages? What does the resurrection of Jesus tell us about how God is working to transform us? The world?
4. When we are confronted by things that 'disorder' our lives, we are often made to feel anxious, depressed, cynical or hopeless. How does the resurrection help us to reorder our lives? What are some practical ways we can practice this kind of reordering?
