The North River Youth & Family Ministry

The Youth & Family Ministry at North River consists of families who have children in grades 6-12 and young mentors who we call teen leaders. The goal of this ministry is to partner with parents to help teens grow spirituality in their friendships, as well as to deepen their own personal convictions about seeking God.



Michael and Sarah Kodinsky oversee North River's Youth & Family Ministry. The ministry is their passion, and their dream is to see the next generation understand God's love and to see families united in the fear of the Lord. Since 2015, the Kodinskys have been working as volunteer leaders of the middle school ministry, leading, planning classes and activities, and recruiting teachers who become teen leaders. Since 2017, they have also been serving as shepherds for the entire Youth & Family Ministry, working alongside the Mackintoshes, participating in teen leader meetings, and working to shape the Youth & Family Ministry into a place where parents are engaging in the spiritual lives of their teens, teen leaders are thriving as they serve, and teens connect with the heart of God

and have a spiritual community to live out their faith in their teen years.

Sarah knows the value of a strong Middle School Ministry having been baptized in middle school, herself, and was raised in a strong Christian family. After spending a year on the foreign mission field, the Kodinskys worked as full-time youth ministers leading a large teen ministry in Boston for two years and leading teen camp for the Northeast churches. They now are raising three young men ages 16, 14 and 12. Michael is in corporate finance, and Sarah leads an international nanny agency serving families with children who have special needs.

Chase and Sarah Mackintosh's roles will be changing as well. They just welcomed their new addition, James Martin Mackintosh, on January 4. Sarah is stepping out of her full-time ministry role and is excited to focus on taking care of their three young children. In the spring of 2017, Chase and Sarah moved to Marietta to invest in our Youth & Family Ministry. They have built a great foundation of family, biblical teaching, and fun over the last three years. The amazing Teen Band and a consistent cadence of "family time" with our monthly potluck and devo over the last two years are two hallmarks of their leadership. They are a highly talented couple with passionate hearts for God and a love for our teens and our teen leaders. Their daughters Nora and Emma are a joy to the teens, and it has been so exciting to welcome baby James to their family over the last month.



Chase will continue leading the Teen Ministry through the end of the school year until Nick and Brie Shoff become the new Youth & Family staff couple (more below). At that time, Chase will continue a supporting role in the Youth & Family Ministry while further developing North River's Creative Arts Ministry with a focus on next generation ministries. Chase will help plan and implement special events for the teens, such as teen services, and continue to lead the Teen Band.

Nick and Brie Shoff were married in May 2018 and have been helping lead the Georgia State campus ministry the last three years. They became best friends and started dating after co-leading the North River summer mission trip to Costa Rica in 2016. In June, they will become North River's lead staff couple in the Youth & Family Ministry.

Nick moved to Atlanta to be trained in the ministry after graduating from University of Georgia, where he helped lead the Athens Campus Ministry during his time there. He became a disciple during his high school years in Ridgefield, Connecticut, where he lived with his family (Steve, Sue, and sister MacKenzie). As a young high school student, Nick started a nonprofit, JamQuest, which aims to train kids to use their gifts to help other kids in need. JamQuest is going strong today, having involved thousands of young people around the world and supported more than 50

students through high school in Nairobi, Kenya!

After high school, Brie moved with her parents to La Paz, Bolivia to volunteer for one year with the HOPE *worldwide* team starting there. During most of her college summers she interned for the Teen Ministry and helped lead the four consecutive trips to Costa Rica. Kamaria Laing joined the Youth & Family Ministry one year ago and has a huge heart to serve the teen girls in the Northwest Community.



Save the Date: March is Women's Month!






Facilities and Requests

The challenge to fit and arrange all that the membership wants to do on our campus continues!

As good stewards of all that God gives us, let us keep the following in mind:

- Treat the buildings as though they are your home. (They are!)
- To request a spot on the North River campus, please go to nrcoc.org, click on Resources and select Facility Request (http://nrcoc.org/facility-request/).
 Easily fill out and submit our new form from a phone or laptop.
- All private events for members weddings, birthday or grad parties, showers, etc., will incur charges.
- HVAC systems (there are six in the FLC) are programmed on Mondays for the week. That means that all requests should be in at least by the Friday of the week before your event. Most requests are processed within 48 hours.
- Don't assume all rooms are available to use if they are empty. You may get booted or those rooms may be considered off limits such as some children's ministry or staff rooms.
- Bear with each other if you don't get your desired spot – or for the time you need it. Until we get more space, flexibility is key!

North River installed a hearing loop system to deliver clear sound to users of hearing aids or cochlear implants and others who have hearing loss. The hearing loop is installed under the carpet in a section on the left side of the auditorium. Please see an usher to identify which seats are within the loop. In this section, any telecoil-equipped hearing device (most hearing aids, all cochlear implants, and some personal receivers) can receive a clear transmission of the message and music without background noise.

If your hearing device has a telecoil, then use your telecoil input when sitting in the looped section. If you do not have a hearing device with a telecoil and need hearing assistance, request a receiver from an usher, and sit in the looped section.
