

The big question: Why did Jonah run?
To be honest, most of us are experienced runners.
To understand why Jonah ran from his mission we have to understand how he felt about the people of Nineveh.
Jonah runs because God's heart doesn't fit his own heart.
Who are your "Ninevites?" Where is your "Nineveh?"

STUDY QUESTIONS FOR March 13

As a child, did you ever run away from home or want to? How did that work for you? Do adults run away from things? Give examples. Is there something in YOUR life that you are or have run away from? Stop and think about it - then answer honestly.

Read Jonah 1:1-16

Others often pay the price for our actions. How did Jonah's disobedience affect the sailors, the people who owned the ship, the people whose cargo the ship was carrying and potentially the people of Nineveh?

How might our disobedience as Christians affect others? Think of this in terms of people in your church, your community and the lost people around you. Take some time to honestly consider this.

Read Jonah 3:1-10

What do we learn about the God's will in verse 1-2? How does God respond to Jonah's disobedience? How does that encourage you?

What did the people of Nineveh do to demonstrate their repentance?

Read Jonah 4:1-11

How did Jonah react when Nineveh repented and God spared them? What does this tell us about the attitude of his heart?

What lesson was God trying to teach Jonah through the plant that sprung up overnight and wilted the next day?

What can we learn about God from the Book of Jonah? What can we learn about ourselves? Who are your Ninevites?
