From his fullness we have all received, grace upon grace. (John 1:16)

Giving and Receiving

There is so much to be said about giving and receiving; in particular, what we discover about ourselves and what we learn about others when we give and when we receive. How we understand who we are and what is important to us is tied up with these human traits of giving and receiving.

I know folks who have a hard time receiving. They are great givers, generous, loving, caring. Yet something about accepting from someone what they so freely offer to others makes them uncomfortable. And then there are those we often call takers - those who have no trouble accepting what is offered. vet don't ever learn about giving.

The relationships we hold dear have, intrinsically, dynamics of giving and receiving, in ways we often do not see - sometimes healthy, sometimes not so life-giving or relationship affirming. Even something as simple as offering a hand in friendship or a moment of time in conversation are ways we give of ourselves to each other, defining, strengthening, renewing relationships through the simple offerings of human comfort. And in receiving the hand offered, the time given, we often find a renewed sense of purpose, of identity, of hope.

Giving and receiving go hand in hand. They complement each other. They encourage an understanding of what it means to be fully human, fully a part of God's Good Creation.

I'm guessing by now you know where I'm going with this giving and receiving thing.

Yes, October is the time of year when we consider our lives together and what it takes for us to be a family, a worship community, and a presence as the Body of Christ in our community. And that conversation has to do with our own giving, and in understanding what it is we receive as members of this gathering of common folk on a common mission to "seek and serve Christ in all persons, loving our neighbors as ourselves."

So, you will find in this issue of *Down by the Riverside* a **Commitment 2016** trifold. I ask that you put this trifold someplace where you can find it when you need it. And between now and November 8th, which is Commitment Sunday this year, I ask you to consider two things: what it is you receive from Gloria Dei, and what of your time, talent, and treasure you are willing to give for the continued mission and ministry of Gloria Dei in the coming year. Occasionally pick up the trifold and read it, then put it away again. And I enourage you to make it a practice during the next couple of months to include in your prayers a petition to God about what you are being called to contribute.

And please understand this: The Church never wants the money we need to feed our children or pay our rent or keep the heat on. The Church is here to give aid when it can to those in need. The Church never asks for the time we need to spend with those in our care who are ill or cannot be left alone, or the time we must spend working for wages to pay the bills. The Church offers a presence to those who need a companion along the way, an encouraging shoulder to lean on, a place to rest. The Church never asks us to sacrifice our own well-being or that of our families. The Church encourages us to be present with one another in heart, body, mind, and soul; to know the truth of living in love and hoping in faith.

What the Church asks for, and asks you to consider, is what God asks of us every day. Look to the birds of the air, the flowers of the earth. See the sun and the moon and the stars. Breathe deeply of the air that gives you life and feel the dampness of the rain that renews the earth. Consider the gift of life itself: of minds to think and hearts to love and souls to know of faith and hope. Know of the gifts of God. See them. Take them. And thank God for them. Then consider, of all we have, and all we need to take care of, what can we give for the life of the Church.

Whatever you do, in word or deed, do everything in the name of the Lord Jesus, giving thanks to God the Father through him.

Vestry Notes

At its July meeting the vestry approved a few projects. One of the largest of those was approval to gain pricing for the possible installation of air conditioning in Riverside Hall. Three vestry members will be researching quotes. We feel as if this would be a great investment for the hall as it not only will make parishioners more comfortable in the summer months but will also allow the church to bring in more revenue with hall rentals during the hotter times of the year.

At the time of the meeting we were still waiting on quotes from our two other larger projects: the graveyard restoration and the installation of security cameras on the grounds.

The vestry approved purchasing a 1/3 page advertisement in the QVNA magazine. On the subject of QVNA, the most re-occurring point when we talk about affiliates is that we still do not have someone to act as a representative for Gloria Dei at the QVNA general meetings. Those meetings occur the same night as vestry meetings (3rd Thursdays of each month) at 7pm. If you feel it is something you may like to do, let any one of us know and we can provide more information. We currently have a few parishioners that attend the Pennsport Civic Association meetings who are able to bring back information about the community as well as inform them of church events.

The vestry began to consider updating the Graveyard Rules and Regulations and received a draft of that update at the July meeting. This subject will be considered in the next few months.

The vestry was also given information on Alcohol and Drug Abuse Policy Guides from The Episcopal Church's recent General Convention and from the Recovery Ministries of the Episcopal Church. This is a subject the vestry will continue to discuss as we consider guidelines for our parish.

The next vestry meetings are Thursday September 17 & October 15 at 7pm. As always we invite anyone to join us whether you have something to share or would just like to me more informed.

History at Gloria Dei

The graveyard once again is receiving a face lift with several tombstones being repaired. One of the tombstones being repaired is located on the south side of the Church by the side door. The heart breaking inscription is no long legible but fortunately a parishioner back in the 1880's recorded the tombstone inscriptions.

Memento of Lizzie the affectionate daughter of Thomas & Harriet Martin
Born March 16th 1837 Died December 24 1857
When Christmas bells rang out their chimes
And holly boughs, and sprigs of thyme
Where hung on many a wall,
Our Lizzie in her beauty's prime,
Lay in our darken'd hall.
No Yule log burned upon the hearth
We sang no song of Christmas mirth!
With hearts bow'd down - with spirit riven
We gave our darling's soul to Heaven
Our gift to Christ the Lord.

Also, being repaired is the oldest legible tombstone, which is very unusual. It is a double tombstone of two sons of our second rector Rev. Andreas Sandel. This tombstone is also located on the south side of the Church close to the walkway.

Here lyeth the body of Peter the son of Andreas Sandel Minister of this Church who dyed April ye 21 A.D. 1708 Aged 2 years & 4 months Here also lyeth the body of Andreas son of Andreas Sandel who died Aug 13 AD 1711 aged 2 weeks & 2 days

STANDING NOTICES

Weddings

Weddings at Gloria Dei (Old Swedes') Church must be scheduled with the clergy at least three months in advance. All weddings in the church will be governed by the Canons of the Diocese of Pennsylvania and the Book of Common Prayer. Pre-marital counseling is a prerequisite. No weddings will be conducted during Lent.

Funerals

When death occurs a family member is asked to contact the clergy so that timely arrangements for a funeral may be made. It is appropriate for the funeral of a Christian to take place in the church. It is also appropriate that funeral arrangements be made in advance and kept in a file in the church office. Burial plots are available for members of the parish in the church's cemetery. Consult the church office for costs and details.

Baptisms

The sacrament of Holy Baptism is celebrated during one of the principle Sunday liturgies and is governed by the Canons of the church and the Book of Common Prayer. Baptism is normally celebrated on one of the four appropriate feast days designated in the Book of Common Prayer. These are: The Baptism of Our Lord (1/11/15). The Great Vigil of Easter (4/5/15); Pentecost (5/24/15); and All Saints Sunday (11/1/15). Other Sundays may be chosen, if necessary, with the advise of the clergy. Baptism instruction will be provided for parents and godparents beforehand.
