Devotional and Prayer

At 1:30 pm Pastor Juthman opened the meeting with prayer.

Financial Report

Trevor Watson, Treasurer, provided a brief overview of finances in 2017. Thanks to the Lord we are in excellent financial condition and look forward to continuing growth in the years to come.

Selwyn Rose, CPA, CMA, our accountant thoroughly explained the financial statements he had prepared. Pastor Juthman thanked Sel for his excellent work, the presentation, and being in attendance at the AGM.

The board has begun moving in the direction of change and looking at how we will prepare our church and ministries to reach this community with the gospel. This past year, we welcomed two new staff members to the HCF staff family. In September, Helen L joined us as our new office assistant, and in December, Ben H joined us as our custodian. Both Helen and Ben have proven to be invaluable members of the staffing team. We appreciate her hard work, diligence, and sense of humor. We appreciate his hard work, and youthful energy.

NEXT GEN MINISTRY UPDATE:

Since our last AGM, we have been praying about our Next Generation ministry especially as it relates to youth and children. In Sidney alone, there are 1400 teenagers under the age of 14, many with no awareness of Jesus. A committee has been formed

consisting of myself, Joyce Harper, and Richard Petrie to begin the search for a person to fill this position.

The committee put together a job description and postings were sent to Summit Pacific College, area PAOC churches, and posted on the BCYD district website. The next generation is a priority for our church as demonstrated by the board including \$30,000 in this year's budget towards the part-time salary for a Next Gen Pastor. It is the vision and goal that leadership will be in place this spring or fall. Please keep the committee and board in prayer as we continue the search. We will continue to keep the congregation informed as to developments.

Almost every week we have visitors who are either travelling through Sidney or looking for a church home. It is our vision that when people come into our services, they would feel that Highway Christian Fellowship is a PLACE TO BELONG!

I would like to express thanks to the board and elders of HCF, Pat D, Outi A, Darlene S, Wenda F, Nils T, Richard P, Einar B, Ike D and Stephen S for their commitment and support.

Community Connection Pastor's Report

Another year ... already? The age-old adage of 'time flies when you are having fun' would make more sense if it was 'time just flies no matter what'. Again, I express my appreciation to the pastor, board and ministry leadership teams for their ongoing support in connecting with our community.

We have seen an evolution in how we reach community and connect with them. We plan to continue reaching out to our community with a focus on two ideas that 'our church address is not a mistake!' & 'how can we help?'

- Hockey & Hot Dogs will start up again this spring, where we have opportunity to be spontaneous with our neighbors. I would love to have some people be available to do coffee etc. with the parents and to chat with them about 'how can we help?'.
- The Big Give in June 2019 is on June 2 this year. Last year there were over 100 churches involved again all across Canada. I have been asked to be the BC rep for this event and am awaiting marketing material from Ottawa to reach out to other churches in Sidney and the Peninsula. Let's pray about how we can bless our neighborhood.
- VBS on July 15-19 with the theme of 'Shipwrecked Rescued by Jesus'. Last summer we ministered to just over 50 students ages 3-11. We had a record number of student helpers ages 12-16 from 3 churches who we had the privilege of mentoring. I received many calls from parents thanking us for running such a 'top notch' program and that their children were still listening to the CDs we gave to everyone who attended. Thank you all for giving so that we could bless others. I am praying for even more staff, helpers, students and other churches to join us and perhaps we can help them in Gospel matters.

We continue to be in discussion with Living Edge about setting up a 'Neighborhood Market' with ongoing items about financial issues and costs. Please pray for both the boards of Living Edge and HCF as we process a start date in the near future.

In view of our ongoing discussions and processing of ideas around Revitalization here at Highway, if we truly believe that 'our church address is not a mistake' then every person in our community who does not have a relationship with Jesus becomes the focus of 'how can we help?'

First...help me- help you. We have several care groups along with our Sunday meetings where we become learners of the Word and enjoy fellowship with others. We are noted for our 'friendliness', let us become noted for 'serving' by asking 'how can I help you today' of anyone who is here. I would love to chat with anyone who wants to try something 'new to you', to explore our community and its needs. Let me help you!

Second... help me- help you- help others. There are as many ways to connect with our neighbors as there are neighbors. From the recently widowed person across the street, to the families in our local schools with minimal income resources, to homeless persons we meet in our coffee shops, to emergency services personnel constantly at risk, to seniors in care who are lonely.... the list goes on. Let me help you start where you are and let God take you to places you never imagined you could go to.

Third... help me- help you- help others- NOW! Another saying is 'there is no time like the present' is better defined by the words of Peter in 2 Peter 3:9 'the Lord isn't slow to do what he promised, as some people think. Rather He is patient for your sake. He doesn't want to destroy anyone but wants all people to have an opportunity to turn to him and change the way they think and act..' or as the NIV translates it 'not wanting anyone to perish, but everyone to come to repentance.'

Fourth... help me- help you- help others- NOW IS ON US.

I recently met with a 'saint' who encouraged me by stating she is' now praying for God to show me my part in the new things to come'. This is now my statement, my daily prayer and I strongly encourage all of us to pray this way, even if we feel we have no talent, time or tithe. God is bigger than anything we are concerned about. He was involved with 'our church address' and is waiting patiently for us to say 'how can we help?

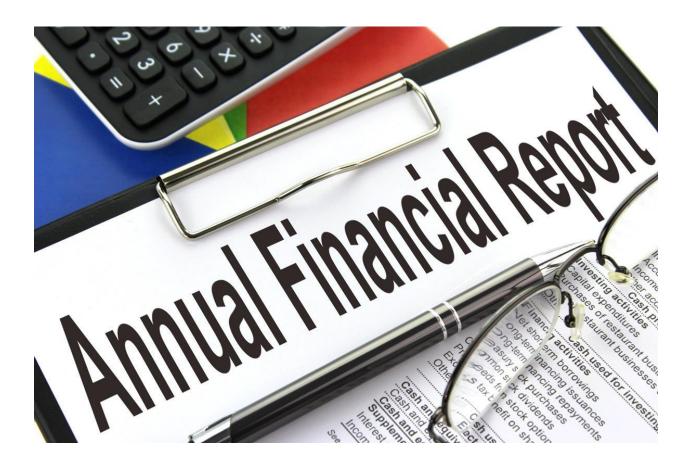
Nanoose Bay Pentecostal Camp Report
