As you are all aware, Jan was eligible for her sabbatical leave in 2019, as a result, the board was tasked with some additional fund raising to help offset additional expenses for coverage for Sunday Services. This was performed by an Ad Hoc committee and was very successful. A big thanks to all who participated and made this possible, this really shows what can be accomplished when we put our mind and spirit into something.

We did not hire a summer student this year, as we knew there would not be adequate staff for supervision.

Unfortunately, we have lost some long-time congregation members over the past year, leaving some great voids in our membership.

We have been and are working on some upgrades to Church equipment. As a result, we paired with the Rotary Club of Stettler, and upgraded with a new projector and screen for the C.E. Wing, as well as connecting our large screen television in the C.E. Wing with the camera in the sanctuary. We also had repairs completed on the pipe organ, as well as having the grand piano tuned and a humidifier installed.

Also, as result of the major hail storm we had this last summer, our building suffered significant damage in all exterior areas, so we have an ongoing insurance claim to get all damages repaired. We are also applying for a grant from the Heritage society to replace hardware on our doors.

This is my last term as chairperson, effectively ending on 31 December 2019. There has also been a couple of other board members retire as well (Do you ever really retire from the Church?) If you are interested, let Jan or another board member know, and they would love to have you come and spend some time


at a board meeting or two, so you have an understanding of what we do at the mysterious meetings we have ten times a year.

Jan Reflects on 2019...

If there's a theme of the year, it's grandparenthood. That -combined with my Sabbatical Time -- have helped me have a whole new lease on life.

Welcoming new life is something I cherish, and key to our faith. Our grandson, Asher was born the day before Palm Sunday. And in May I started rehearsals as a participant in the moving drama which is the Badlands Passion Play. So, these two things were Easter experiences writ large. They represent the kind of things that give us a whole new purpose for being alive; open us to wonder.

As a 93-year-old church (great, great, grandparent age) we need the things that are life-changing, life-giving, wholly and holy. Things which remind us love never dies.

It's when we welcome new faces into the congregation; receive people through baptism and reaffirmation of faith; and add new small group ministries (Healing Hands has just begun), that I'm renewed in/through ministry. Having colleagues to depend upon was shown as Barbara Lieurance, David Holmes, and Mervyn Penfound were of particular help to cover weddings, funerals (including our family member Kathy H) and Sunday Services during sabbatical, summer holiday, Easter and Christmas.

It was a great feeling when Michele offered to coordinate three new fundraising ~ friendship building opportunities. The flow-art paint nights, and artisan market, as well as all the things we've hosted traditionally, were wonderful opportunities for us to engage with people on beyond Sunday mornings. Similarly, we've found that connecting with kids for an art day during the Spring Break; and hosting "Kids Can Cook" opportunities this past summer, put wind beneath our wings as well.

During my Sabbatical-Holiday time I was able to worship with eight other congregations. Pew-sitting is a great thing for ministers! While there are always differences, it's good to focus on the commonalities. One being that there's a deep need for human and spiritual connection. I was reminded to be open, always, to meet people where they're at and join the journey, by heart.

My "church" is a network of those I interact with in person, through social media, in the upstairs, down and double-downstairs of this building, in the community, and vicariously through the global partnerships we have in mission. I consider it a compliment when I'm told "I see you at everything, Jan", because I am pleased to walk this path with others. Sometimes we seem to know quite clearly what that looks like, and where we're going, and other times we walk a whole new way into a whole new day.

Grandparenthood automatically puts me to thinking about succession. Playing the role of a priest in the Passion Play did too. Good thing that was an act. In "real life" I wouldn't want to be known as one who'd fight to uphold a hierarchical system in opposition to Jesus' reform movement. Thankfully his passion for the possible was continued through the fledgling group of those left behind, but not abandoned by the Spirit. This is the inheritance of our faith family. New chapters are being written. May it be good news for us and others.

Events of the wider church that I have attended as a representative of Stettler United Church are:

- 1. Women of the United Church in Chinook Winds and Northern Spirit Regions annual meeting "Who is Our Neighbour" at Star of the North Retreat Centre, St. Albert from April 4-6, 2019

I have provided reports on each of these events to the church board. At the board's request I invited Joel Den Haan, Community of Faith Support/Strategy Consultant to conduct a workshop in November to explore the possibilities of sharing space with other groups in Stettler who have a similar mission/vision as us. Since that meeting, a "Shared Space" Task Group was formed to investigate the viability of sharing our building with the Stettler Learning Council. Although this partnership **did not** materialize, it gave us the opportunity to examine what space we have, what we are willing to share and our potential for collaborative partnerships. The task group continues to work on this project with Joel's quidance.

I will end my report with words from Helen Reed, the Presiding Officer of the Chinook Winds Region Executive:

"I believe that the church is meant to work together and be partners in making a difference in our communities and in the world. My hope is that we will let go of some of our previous habits, jump into this newness together, finding refreshing freedoms: in getting to know new partners; in meeting different people who are passionate about the same things we are; in hearing, respecting and engaging in each other's stories; in choosing new directions to be God's best people."

# **Property**

While we still did not have an active committee in 2019, we are thankful to have people we can call upon for decision and action as needed.

The janitorial contract for the Dust Fairies was not renewed. In November Tree Cleaning was hired for janitorial. The cost is significantly lower with this company.

We have also hired Allen Prince to look after snow removal. To date he has kept our sidewalks clean of snow and ice.

Bob Richardson continues to be our contact person for maintenance items.

Here are things we've attended to (and some that are ongoing) that help keep our building in good working order:

- The cooler in the kitchen was purchased and replaced in January 2019.
- The Stettler Rotary Club installed a new ceiling projector, screen and updated the sound system in the CE wing.
- The camera from the sanctuary was connected to the tv and system in the CE wing after the Rotary had completed their changes.
- The sanctuary door, and those on the CE wing stick and are difficult to open. The heritage society will have to be contacted before any repairs/changes can be made.
- Jim Tennant was to speak to Kirk Blake regarding hardwiring the sanctuary to strengthen the wifi signal.
- The organ was repaired and tuned.
- The pianos were tuned. Barbara-Lynn and David Goodwin donated an upright piano that has been refinished, it has also been tuned and is in the CE wing. Who would like one or two extra pianos?
- A humidifier was ordered and installed in the grand piano in the sanctuary. This should result in it having to be tuned so often.
- The carpets were shampooed; but the tile floors were not redone in 2019. Kevin Pike said if the floors were stripped properly and kept up, they should not have to be stripped for 5 years or more. Hopefully this will be done in 2020.
- The tap in the kitchen has been fixed, and the sprayer tap was leaking, Bob has fixed this a few times, and we have been asked to keep an eye on it.
- In July we sustained substantial hail damage. Betty Birch & Jim Tennant have been in contact with Sandy from the Heritage Society, who has been in contact with the contractor, so the rules of a Heritage building are followed. At this writing it is still ongoing.
- Received a quote for a chimney liner for the furnaces in CE.

"We think it will be a nice, relaxing day.

"It's a chance to highlight creativity and the artisans in town, and gives people a chance to get some shopping done," she said.

#### STETTLER & DISTRICT FOOD BANK SOCIETY

Although we are a separate society and operate independently of the church, we are grateful for the tremendous support that Stettler United Church provides to the food bank. We have over the years gradually taken up more space and are operating more hours which in itself becomes an activity and entity of Stettler United. We pay a nominal "rent" to the church.

In 2019 we had a total of 2726 adult visits, serving an average of 227 adults and 127 children each month. We have about 300 separate households in our files. Our numbers have remained quite stable for the past three years. Households with school age children may visit the food bank twice each month. Adult only households are welcome once each month. The cost of the average hamper that is given to a family of 3 to 4 is about \$100.00

Every week 15 to 20 volunteers keep the food bank running. We are thankful for all these volunteers who pick up groceries, stock shelves and work at the food bank. The staff at the church is also a huge help to us and we are very grateful for their contribution. With food bank open two afternoons and one evening, and volunteers delivering and stocking groceries, there is food bank activity every day of the week and sometimes on the weekend.

We have no paid staff and receive no government funding. All the food that is given by the food bank is either donated or purchased with money that is donated by this community.

We are so grateful for all the individuals, clubs, organizations, Hutterite colonies, churches, schools, businesses and companies who donate time, food and cash. We live in a very generous community and without your support our Food Bank would not be able to operate.
