Happy Anniversary to us! 125 years as a Diocese! How will we celebrate? The Diocese of Calgary Diocesan Council has chosen to support Habitat for Humanity. Fellowship and Food Groups is a ministry centred on **PEOPLE** and **FOOD!** All adults are in-

vited to join in the sharing of a meal and an evening of easy conversation and hopefully some spontaneous fun. These groups have an emphasis on fellowship as they allow you to meet and spend time with various members of our parish in a relaxed setting. The groups we belong to change three times a year so we meet new people every few months. Groups are 6 - 8 adults, who try to meet monthly. Groups will be randomly assembled by the group coordinator and a lead host will be selected for each group. The host will contact the members of their group to arrange the details of the first gathering. Each group plans its own get-togethers and meets together once a month over a period of 4 months. Groups can meet at one another's homes, at a restaurant, at a park - it is up to each group. The emphasis is on fun and fellowship, so you don't have to be a gourmet cook to participate. For individuals who don't feel their cooking skills are up to the challenge, feel free to have a pre-prepared dish. This isn't about cooking, it is about spending time together and having fun!
