Did you know that our Aboriginal people have a population of almost 1.5 million in over 1,000 communities stretched across our nation? This is a people and a culture that has literally been here since before the beginning of Canada and yet, it is estimated that less than 10% profess a Saving knowledge in Jesus Christ.

You'd think for as long as the Gospel has been proclaimed here in North America that better inroads into our First Peoples communities would have been established by now. But that simply has not been the case.

The plight of the Aboriginal has been well documented: Alcohol & substance abuse, poverty & homelessness. Some studies project that within 10 years half of all Aboriginal children will grow up fatherless. The suicide rate of Aboriginal youth is almost 6

times that of the national average.

Here's How ABA can Help:

- Simply contact our office via phone, email or through our website. (Anyone is eligible to take the courses we offer)
- A "New Student Registration Form" will need to be filled out and returned to our office (by mail or fax)
- Included with the submitted forms needs to be a cheque for all appropriate academic fees made out to Aboriginal Bible Academy
- Once all forms and payment have been received by our office the process takes about 10 days by which time you can have your curriculum and study materials in your hand! If you choose to take your course online....you can be well into your studies in 3-5 days!

SOME COURSE SYNOPSIS

ACTS: THE HOLY SPIRIT AT WORK IN BELIEVERS

• A thorough study of the content, purposes, principles, and applications of Acts. The course emphasizes the role of the Holy Spirit in the early church and today. Attention is given to the geographical, numerical, cultural, and theological growth of the church from Jerusalem to Rome. The journeys of Paul are examined as the background for his epistles.

LOCAL CHURCH IN EVANGELISM

• The local church is the provenance of evangelism for reaching its community and the world. After a foundational, biblical theology of the Great Commission and the Holy Spirit's role in evangelism, this course proposes a comprehensive and integrated approach to evangelism in the local church that avoids over-compartmentalizing evangelism and discipleship.

CONFLICT MANAGEMENT FOR CHURCH LEADERS

• A biblical approach to conflict resolution. This course offers a scriptural way to deal with the inevitable occasions when conflict arises, particularly in a church setting. It offers practical principles for resolving the conflict in a manner that is pleasing to God.
