A third way to express our Thanksgiving would be to invite a friend or friends to join you as we celebrate our Patronal Festival (St. Luke the Evangelist Day) on Tuesday, October 22 at 5:30 pm. Invite your friend, a family member, or a neighbor and bring your favourite prepared entrée, salad, or dessert as we enjoy a great evening sharing a potluck meal together.
