## **Guiding 'Signposts'**

Questions to ask myself as I reflect on my journey toward Christlikeness.

- 1. How would I describe my relationship with Jesus Christ? How is my relationship changing? What difference is Christ making in my life? How do I know I have a relationship with Jesus?
- 2. What am I doing; to study the Word of God, in my prayer life, to give generously, to ensure I am worshipping? What is hindering me? Has my practice changed? Can I see application in my life?
- 3. In what ways are others seeing the fruit of the Spirit in my life? Is there a greater desire to connect with God? In what ways?
- 4. Do I know what my spiritual gifts are? How am I using them? How are they being confirmed?
- 5. How do I resolve conflict with others?
  Am I practicing confession, forgiveness and reconciliation in personal and corporate relationships? What are my family relationships like? Who and how am I helping to grow spiritually? In what ways can a relationship with a peer mentor or accountability partner help me?
- 6. How am I actively investing in my local church community? How is participation in my church helping me grow?
- 7. Am I able to share the Gospel? Have I taken the opportunity to do so? Do I have a greater concern/compassion for those yet to know Christ? How am I expressing it?

## **Opportunities for Growth**

### Individually

 Ongoing and regular personal study, regular devotions, inspirational reading, personal prayer, Sabbath time.

#### With Another

 Mentoring/discipling/accountability relationships that are infused with prayer; ongoing or for a period of time; could be informal or formal in nature.

#### Small Groups

 Based on interest, needs, geography or demographics for a specified period of time. Focus on social connection and relationships; developing a caring community with opportunities for teaching, learning, outreach and service; grounded in prayer.

### Large Gatherings

 Corporate worship, teaching and celebration; building identity and support in a more formal setting.

## The 7 Characteristics of a Maturing Disciple

## A maturing disciple...has a deepening relationship with Jesus.

- Recognizes it is only God's grace offered through the cross that is able to address his/her sinful nature.
- Has turned from sin and self and accepted Jesus as Lord and Saviour and abides in Him.
- Is learning to walk daily by faith in obedience, joy and love.

John 15:4, 9-17; Mark 8:34-38; Mark 1:17; Ephesians 2:8-9

## 2. A maturing disciple...practices spiritual disciplines.

- Consistently engages in personal and corporate prayer, study and meditation in the Word, tithing and giving generously, and individual and group worship.
- Practices a new pattern of life (thought, attitude and action) modelled on the life and teaching of Jesus.

# 3. A maturing disciple...has an empowering relationship with the Holy Spirit.

- Seeks the filling of the Holy Spirit in order to walk in His presence and power.
- Exercises the 'fruit of the Spirit' and the 'spirit of righteousness' as he/she grows in truth, love and accountability.

# 4. A maturing disciple...is connected to and aware of his/her unique place in God's Kingdom.

- Willingly identifies and develops spiritual gifts, talents and abilities.
- Regularly serves the church family and those in need through the exercise of these spiritual gifts, talents and abilities.

## 5. A maturing disciple...has a genuine relationship with other believers.

- Intentionally invests in others' spiritual lives through mentoring relationships.
- Practices confession, forgiveness and reconciliation in personal and corporate relationships.
- Encourages and exhorts others in what is learned from God's Word.

## 6. A maturing disciple...connects with the local church community.

- Values genuine biblical community (fellowships, worships, learns, breaks bread together).
- Lives a life that reflects Jesus' love for others.
- Regularly serves the church community with time and resources.

## 7. A maturing disciple...accepts his/ her relationship to the world.

- Has a compassionate heart for all people groups and all nations.
- Puts that felt need into action through the use of personal resources and regular prayer.
- Cultivates authentic relationships with those who do not know Jesus as personal Saviour and Lord.
- Gives witness to the Gospel through word and action.
