SERMON: REMAIN IN CHRIST - ON OUR OWN, WE CAN DO NOTHING TO GLORIFY GOD

John 15:1-17 (CSB)

The Vine and the Branches

"I am the true vine, and my Father is the gardener.

2 Every branch in me that does not produce fruit he removes, and he prunes every branch that produces fruit so that it will produce more fruit. 3 You are already clean because of the word I have spoken to you. 4 Remain in me, and I in you. Just as a branch is unable to produce fruit by itself unless it remains on the vine, neither can you unless you remain in me. 5 I am the vine; you are the branches. The one who remains in me and I in him produces much fruit, because you can do nothing without me. 6 If anyone does not remain in me, he is thrown aside like a branch and he withers. They gather them, throw them into the fire, and they are burned. 7 If you remain in me and my words remain in you, ask whatever you want and it will be done for you. 8 My Father is glorified by this: that you produce much fruit and prove to be my disciples. - 9 "As the Father has loved me, I have also loved you. Remain in my love. 10 If you keep my commands you will remain in my love, just as I have kept my Father's commands and remain in his love.
- 11 "I have told you these things so that my joy may be in you and your joy may be complete.
- 12 "This is my command: Love one another as I have loved you.

John 15:1-17 (CSB)

13 No one has greater love than this: to lay down his life for his friends. 14 You are my friends if you do what I command you. 15 I do not call you servants anymore, because a servant doesn't know what his master is doing. I have called you friends, because I have made known to you everything I have heard from my Father. 16 You did not choose me, but I chose you. I appointed you to go and produce fruit and that your fruit should remain, so that whatever you ask the Father in my name, he will give you.

17 "This is what I command you: Love one another.

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- 1) Read Isaiah 5:1-7. In what ways is Jesus the "true vine" that ancient Israel was intended to be?
- 2) What does Jesus mean when he says "you can do nothing without me" (verse 5)?
- 3) When does it glorify God to do good things? And when does it not? What are some good things you do which glorify God?
- 4) Taking Jesus' picture of us as branches, how do we remain in the vine? And why is it important?
- 5) Jesus puts together "remaining in him (the vine)" and "obeying my commands". How do you see these fitting together?
- 6) What's the difference between a servant and a friend, as outlined in verses 14-16a?
- 7) How does friendship with Jesus work? What is it like, and what is it not like?
- 8) To what purpose does Jesus call us friends?
- 9) With the spiritual gifts and talents that Jesus has given you, how are you -or how can you "produce fruit" that glorifies God?

As a volunteer of Prison Fellowship I would like to introduce you to the program **The Angel Tree.**

This program is run by Prison Fellowship which gives gifts to children between the ages of 0-15 of prisoners at Christmas. Normally church members would purchase a gift, however because of COVID restrictions this is not possible and therefore we would like to ask you for a monetary donation.



I am coordinating this program with the diaconate and together we will purchase gifts from the money received on your behalf, and post off the gifts.

Helping one child is simple. All you need to do is make an offering of \$30.00 for a gift, plus \$12-18 for postage. You can deposit this money into the Diaconate Bank Account noting the deposit is for the Angel Tree by the 15th November 2020.

The giving of a gift is a blessing for these children who feel excluded from normal family life because they have a parent in prison. Through receiving a gift, both the children and the prisoners feel that someone cares for them, and in the past this giving has changed their lives.



Pray for God's people throughout our nation that we will be examples of God's love, grace and peace bringing his comfort to an anxious nation.

Please continue to pray for our governments that they will lead us with wisdom through both internal problems and external pressures, pray that they will not be intimidated but do what is right in God's sight.

Please pray for our brothers and sisters in North Korea. A Christian who escaped North Korea twice tells Premier the country is failing to contain coronavirus and that border controls means there is a severe food shortage and rising prices. Timothy Cho fled North Korea in his twenties when he was denied entry to the army but was sent back and went to prison and was tortured. He later tried again and was put in prison in Shanghai, where he became a Christian. He was then extradited and now lives in the UK, where he graduated and works with Christian charity Open Doors. Cho said that the coronavirus has hit the country badly: "People are dying so easily once they have shown the symptoms because their bodies are so weak to defend, with an ongoing lack of food and nutrition and malnutrition and starvation, and they die all of a sudden, and so quickly.

"North Korea was already presenting with existing issues of ongoing starvation and malnutrition and economic crisis. What's been happening since this virus lockdown is they had closed the borders with China. So, it has radically decreased the amount of imported food and medicine, this is the reason why a lot of items' prices have gone up to more than four times and some of these imported food and foodstuff are difficult to find in the market." With the blackmarket collapsing, and stalls closing down, more people are struggling to survive as it can cost two months' salary to buy a kilo of rice. Weather problems have also damaged internal produce. Mudslides and flooding have meant "vast areas of farmland, including rice fields have been wiped out," according to Cho.

The country is denying help from the United Nations because of its priority of secrecy. Cho explained: "North Korea is not willing to let UN representatives have free access to the country in exchange for aid as there are too many human rights abuses that would be exposed. For the same reason, they aren't willing to take any further steps towards nuclear demilitarisation to get international sanctions lifted." Open Doors is waiting for a window of opportunity to help Christians in the country. It estimates there are between 200,000 and 400,000 Christians in North Korea with between 50,000 and 70,000 in camps which no prisoner leaves alive. Inmates are tortured, starved and work long hours under dangerous conditions. Sometimes they are used for chemical tests or executed.

Please also bring the plight of our brothers and sisters in Ethiopia before the throne of God. At least 500 Christians have been killed in an ongoing spate of coordinated door-to-door attacks and thousands of traumatized survivors have fled for their lives over the last few months in southern Ethiopia's Oromia regional state, including its capital Addis Ababa, according to reports. Members of Qeerroo (which means "bachelors"), a youth movement of men from the ethnic Oromo group who are predominantly Muslim, have allegedly gone on a killing spree in some parts of the Oromia regional state, extending south, southeast and east of Addis Ababa, since the assassination of a popular Oromo singer, Hachallu Hundessa, on June 29. "Some of the Qeerroo militants held lists of Christians and were helped by local authorities, often run by Muslims in the Oromia region, to find individuals, particularly those actively involved in supporting the Church"

"The Qeerroo extremists arrived in cars and, armed with guns, machetes, swords and spears, sought out and slaughtered Christians. Children were forced to witness their parents being brutally murdered with machetes," it added. An Oromo Christian was beheaded after he refused to tear off the thread around his neck, which is worn by many Ethiopian Christians as a sign of their baptism. The attackers told his wife that only those who prostrate before Allah for prayer are considered part of the Oromo community. While local Muslims in the Bale Agarfa area saved some Christians, risking their lives in doing so, police in some incidents stood by and watched as the Christians were murdered. Christians' businesses and houses were burned down, vandalized or destroyed.
