BACKGROUND ON THE INSIGNIA

The insignia for *The Order of the Diocese of New Westminster* is a round medallion featuring the official badge of the Diocese in full coloured enamel struck by Pressed Metal Products of Vancouver. The badge was granted by the Chief Herald of Canada on May 15, 2007.

The colours and many of the symbols on the badge are derived from the coat of arms of the Diocese, granted more than half a century ago. The colours blue and gold are the main colours in the coat of arms and in the badge represent both heaven, and the sea and the riches of the Spirit. The Christian cross takes the form found on the medieval coat of arms attributed to St. Edward the Confessor and long associated with Westminster Abbey. In the badge another symbol of St. Edward, the small birds, are given a Canadian flavour with tails ending in a maple leaf shape, fitting for a Canadian Anglican diocese. The wavy white line symbolizes both the ocean and the river which surround much of the Diocese as well as the waters of baptism. The insignia hang from a special blue, gold and white silk ribbon, designed by two leading experts in Canadian symbols, Dr. Christopher McCreery and Major Carl Gauthier, and woven by the famous English firm of Toye Kenning.

WHEN IS THE MEDAL WORN?

The medallion is to be worn around the neck on the special blue, white and gold ribbon. It is appropriate for members of the Order to wear the medallion at special occasions, in parishes, or at the Diocesan level. Examples of this would be a worship service or event where the Bishop of the Diocese of New Westminster is present, at Synod or Diocesan services and events and at the installation of new members to the Order. In addition to the medallion the members of the Order are given a small lapel pin that can be worn with everyday dress.

MS. KATHRYN (KATE) WALKER
Christ Church Cathedral

Upon the presentation of the Order of the Diocese of New Westminster 2020
The Citation (*as recorded in the Permanent Register of the Order*)

Kathryn (Kate) Walker is a transplant from the United States. Married to Tom, a Vietnam War resister, they travelled to Vancouver, landing in Canada on July 4, 1967—American Independence Day. Perhaps it was her Grade 5 project on Canada, embellished with National Geographic photos of igloos, Mounties and mountains, that provided a natural connection to Canada. Or was it her French-Canadian grandfather? Whatever the touchstone, Kate exemplifies the dedicated, proud immigrant become citizen.

In Kate's professional work, she was a marketing and sales rep for various book publishers. Her volunteer work included being a broadcaster and researcher in the early days of Vancouver Co-operative Radio. Creating opportunities for sharing knowledge and learning have been fundamental, both professionally and personally. Kate's love of her adopted country and her commitment to community stretches across three broad domains: civic engagement, social justice advocacy and environmental protection.

She is a woman who puts her foot on a bicycle pedal not a vehicle accelerator. In all weather—fair or foul—she rides around the city to her various meetings or action sites. Reducing her carbon footprint is a high priority for her as is supporting with time, effort and talent, those causes which bolster people who live on the margins. In this regard, every Wednesday she dons an apron and together with a faithful group of volunteers, she chops veggies, washes dishes, serves food, welcomes guests to Christ Church Cathedral's Maundy Café. Similarly, as a pastoral visitor every Tuesday at Vancouver General Hospital, she brings comfort to those who find themselves ill or near death, and to their families. For over 21 years she has conveyed kindness to hundreds of people.

And there's more—since 2006, Kate has been an exemplary leader of Christ Church Cathedral's Healing Touch Ministry. Through her guidance, a team of 22 volunteers routinely offers Healing Touch to those in the parish needing support due to illness, emotional distress or other factors. Kate would say that these two areas—concern and action for environmental and social justice—motivate her to work toward systemic change, be it political, social or economic. Her desire to bring fair, just and equitable policies to our city, province and country guides her work for enhancing life therein.

Her generous love spreads wisely to her three adult children, two grandsons, many friends, and those whom she supports in varied ways. Personally, she derives much pleasure from growing vegetables in her home garden, yoga and discussing books at her book clubs. Ted has been involved in numerous important initiatives at the Parish and Diocesan levels. As a former justice of the BC Court of Appeal, Ted lent his legal expertise and forensic ability to assess statutory provisions to the Diocese's Task Force on Constitution and Canons. That group undertook the substantial project of a thorough updating of the Constitution, Canons and Rules of Order, which ultimately were approved unanimously by Diocesan Synod in May 2019.

At the Parish level, Ted has served as a Trustee at the Cathedral, and in addition to that responsibility, has served as a procedural advisor to Cathedral priests-in-charge in the context of Vestry meetings. Ted previously chaired the Succession and Transition Committee tasked with establishing a process to identify and hire a new Rector for the Cathedral. In that capacity he consulted and worked extensively with the Archbishop. Ted has served as a member of the Cathedral Search Committee, and recently acted as one of the Cathedral's representatives on the Bishop's Advisory Committee on Appointments, narrowing down the pool of applicants for the position to a strong short list.

More broadly, the Cathedral's arts community (and Vancouver's in general) have benefitted from Ted's long-standing and extensive contributions in those areas. In addition to his generous financial support of the arts, Ted has been involved in the governance of the Vancouver Symphony Orchestra, Chor Leoni, and other non-profit organizations, assisting them with leadership transitions as well.
