SERMON: SCATTERLINGS KNOW HOW TO HANDLE SUFFERING

1 Peter 4:12-19 (CSB)

CHRISTIAN SUFFERING

12 Dear friends, don't be surprised when the fiery ordeal comes among you to test you, as if something unusual were happening to you. 13 Instead, rejoice as you share in the sufferings of Christ, so that you may also rejoice with great joy when his glory is revealed. 14 If you are ridiculed for the name of Christ, you are blessed, because the Spirit of glory and of God rests on you. 15 Let none of you suffer as a murderer, a thief, an evildoer, or a meddler. 16 But if anyone suffers as a Christian, let him not be ashamed but let him glorify God in having that name. 17 For the time has come for judgment to begin with God's household, and if it begins with us, what will the outcome be for those who disobey the gospel of God?

18 And if a righteous person is saved with difficulty, what will become of the ungodly and the sinner?

19 So then, let those who suffer according to God's will entrust themselves to a faithful Creator while doing what is good.

SERMON NOTES

DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

Discussion questions:

- 1. Why do you think suffering is so prevalent in the world?
- 2. In what ways have you, or are you currently, experiencing suffering?
- 3. How has God changed you through your suffering? What lessons did you learn?
- 4. How can you help others with those lessons?
- 5. Peter instructs the believers to rejoice 'as they share in Christ's sufferings'. How does the fact that Jesus suffered help us?
- 6. What does entrusting yourself to a faithful creator (v19) look like for you? How do you do it?
- 7. Peter says that you should do this, while doing good. Why do you think it is important to keep doing good, even in the midst of suffering?
- 8. Is it ever God's will for people to suffer? Why or why not?
- 9. How has this passage changed the way you understand suffering?

DISCIPLESHIP DIGEST

Over the last several weeks we have been exploring the 4 E's of the discipleship journey:

Engaging, Evangelising, Establishing, and Equipping. This week I want to start looking at the final E — **Equipping.**

Traditionally churches in our end of the theological spectrum have been fairly good at this final E – Equipping.

Equipping the saints for works of service is more than simply listening to a sermon on a Sunday morning. Equipping has to do with encouraging people to start living out the call God has placed on their lives to be disciple makers in the world.

Now because people are so varied, and we have a multitude of different skill sets, abilities, interests and the like, there is no way that the church can specifically equip each person to do disciple making work in their own specific context.

We can however provide general training that each and every member of a church will need to interact with others. Most Christians will then tend to "specialise" in one area of life, where God has particularly gifted them and placed them to have an impact for the kingdom.

You can think of this almost like our schooling system.

Primary school happens during the establishing phase of discipleship – here Christians are taught the basics of faith and the important doctrines we need to believe (like how salvation works and what it means to us).

Equipping is like high school, where we are taught the general skills that every believer needs to have, like how to share your testimony, how to read the bible, how to pray with someone, and how to share the gospel. Most of us will want to also pursue some further education, specific to our own personal calling. We might attend a conference on Christianity in business, or the arts. We might learn from other Christians in the sphere of science and technology as to how they are bringing Christ's lordship to bear on those areas of life. We may want to focus on music or sport or teaching. The task of the church, is to equip believers at that high school level, and encourage people to pursues their own further equipping training at the tertiary level.

I think unfortunately many churches, especially many reformed churches, have lost that high school, level focus. I myself cannot remember ever being taught how to read scripture as a young person, or how to share the gospel, or indeed even how to pray.

As we continue to pursue disciplemaking as the focus of this congregation, we have been getting back to that middle level training, and once COVID settles down, we will continue offering workshops and other skills based events. Think about what Christian skills you would most like to learn and be trained in, and let us know.

Please pray for our brothers and sisters in Ethiopia.

'They came to my home and began to knock on our door violently. We tried to escape with our children via the window. They burned my home and grain mill business. But with the kindness of God, I have been able to save my children from being burnt.' This was the testimony of Mrs Eniye Cheru, whose family survived when the Christians of Derra town in Ethiopia were attacked in the early hours of 30 June.

But hundreds of other Christians, from a wide span of ethnic groups, were killed in the co-ordinated attacks of late June and early July. Police stood by and watched as Christians were carefully selected and murdered, Christian homes and Christian businesses destroyed. Thousands of Christians were displaced; many are still sheltering in church buildings, not daring to return home. 'These targeted genocides of Christians by Muslim extremists are going on unabated in the south, south-east and east of Addis Ababa,' wrote an Ethiopian Christian to Barnabas Fund on 26 August.

The attackers were members of Qeerroo (literally, 'bachelors'), a youth movement of Oromo men. The Oromo are an ethnic group who have traditionally been Muslim. The anti-Christian violence was ostensibly triggered by the assassination of an Oromo singer called Hachalu Hundessa, who was shot dead while driving in the Ethiopian capital, Addis Ababa, at around nine pm on 29 June.

By midnight the attacks had begun in towns across Oromia regional state – attacks that showed the hallmarks of careful advance planning. Some of the Querroo carried lists of Christians and went door to door, seeking the individuals to kill them. The emphasis was on those who were active supporters of the Church.

We gained four communitive members who have joined our church since lockdown. Some of them have joined growth groups and we are hoping to get the others included in a group soon.

Incoming Correspondence:

We received a poster from the RCYC on the state of the nation on youth ministry giving us an indication of what we should focus on for the future.

Online church services:

We are learning as we continue. We have a pretty constant attendance of 50-55 people tuning in on a Sunday morning.

Four E's

Engaging:

Online Growth Groups: We are still encouraging all to join a Growth Group. It is great way to stay engage with our Church Community

Online reach of service: It is progressing pretty good. On average our posts reach between 700 to 1000 people per week. **Food hampers:** With lockdown they are unable to access school families. Deacons are staying in touch through phone calls. If you know of anyone in need of some support during this time, please call Margreet Day.

Evangelizing:

Other activities or opportunities during Stage 3 lockdown: We still want to slot in a Christianity Explore course over Zoom perhaps around October.

It would be great if we could commit through the growth groups to pray for someone to come to the Lord so that we have been praying for quite a few people by the time that we want to run the course.

Establishing:

Growth groups: Every week the elder could do an announcement after the snippet of the growth group encouraging people to contact Annandra in order to join a group.

Equipping:

This month is the second round of our couching conversations with Chris.

One of the Denomination has been talking about and will be presented to the Senate going forwards is Denominational Structure for running Internships within local churches. We should know if and how they want to proceed with this by March 2021

Thanksgiving collection: Sound equipment can now be updated due to the generous contributions received.
