3. Principal's Report – Kathy O'Sullivan

- Into Phase II of Seismic project the demolition of Building B & C.
- Still attending Site Meetings.
- VSB/Resource Audit Jan. 19 VSB audit team came to review all files. Worked today to have them as up to date as possible. A few challenges that need to be completed before Friday, Jan 22.
- VSB has just posted a bunch of information regarding seismic upgrades in the district.
- 2015-2016 Projections We sent home Are You Moving Form? This is to capture our student enrollment for next year. Currently we have 339 students. International student enrollment is 18. The VSB is projecting 297, which does not include international students. (Projecting 316 for Sept. with international students).

- Anti-Bullying awareness: looking for guest speakers to come in that week, including an information evening for parents. Selling more pink clothing for support.

- The Parent Advocacy Network (PAN), in conjunction with Families Against Cuts to Education (FACE), is targeting the provincial government with a goal to deliver hundreds of paper postcards - campaign well underway - and thousands of online signatures from citizens declaring "I Stand with the Standing Committee" to increase funding for public education.

- Vancouver Board of Education just put out an Interim Long Range Facilities Plan has
 just come out. We are lucky to already be in seismic upgrading. Board requesting
 schools be at 95% occupancy to remain open. They have suggested closing a number
 of schools not meeting occupancy, or repurpose for schools going through seismic
 upgrade. Long list of schools in jeopardy of closure. Link will be put on our website for
