

Sunday, February 23rd, 2020

TAKE NOTICE the Annual Vestry Meeting will be held immediately following the 10:00 am service on SUNDAY, February 23<sup>rd</sup>,2020 in this Parish, for the purpose of receiving reports, electing officers and Delegates and Alternate Delegates to Synod.

The Vestry of the Parish consists of all baptized persons of the age of sixteen or over who are accustomed worshippers within the Parish and whose names have been on the Membership Roll of the Parish for at least the three months preceding the Vestry Meeting, but no person shall have their names on the Membership roll of more than one Parish in this Diocese at the same time. Only those members of the Vestry who have within the preceding twelve months provided an identifiable commitment of time, talents or financial resources to the Parish or have been in receipt of the ministrations of the Parish because of illness or other incapacity shall have the right to vote at any Vestry Meeting.

Adoption of minutes of the minutes & attendance from Vestry meeting held February 18,2018 was moved by Pam Tattersfield and seconded by Edie Hildreth. Carried

David thanked Elaine for all her hard work in getting the vestry reports collected, printed and on time.

David requested a motion for all reports to be accepted at once. It was moved by Peg Tinney and seconded by Dorothy Bruce. Carried

#### David Hildreth spoke:

#### The Rector's Report ~ The Reverend Cameron Gutjahr

#### **Getting Started**

It really was an exciting 2019 at St. John's, and I can only speak about the last 6 months of it that I experienced since joining you in July. I give thanks that Archbishop Melissa has sent me here — I feel the guidance of the Holy Spirit in all of it. I could not imagine a better place to begin my ordained ministry. So much has happened, even in only 6 months, that I will only provide some of my favourite highlights!

But before anything more, let me first thank you: my amazing team of wardens, parish council members, administrator, cleaner, the myriad of dedicated volunteers – all of you members, friends, siblings in Christ, who have welcomed me so warmly; who have been so flexible and generous with your time and energy in service to the Gospel. None of the ministry that St. John's has done in the past year would be possible without you.

#### **Relationship Building**

The last 6 months of 2019 were characterized, for me, by relationship building. 'Coffee, Cookies and Conversation with Cameron' in August was a huge success, and I was able to visit with well over half the congregation. Visiting has continued since then, both with members of the congregation, and with the wider community.

I have been intentional with my time, trying to spend a lot of it out in the community, to build relationships, and to be a visible reminder of the Church's presence, and God's love in the world. I have spent time helping, visiting and meeting people at the foodbank, through the Squamish Multifaith Association, through Community Christmas Care, at the Remembrance Day service, at the Hospice Society Memory Tree event, through our user groups that we host every week, meeting up with local ministers, and just generally trying to do a good deal of my work out and about throughout town. To increase our visibility and presence, and to encourage building relationship in our neighbourhood, it has also been fun to play with our new chalkboard sign, and to organize a little table to hand out candy and hot chocolate at Halloween.

Among many firsts this year, this was also my first Christmas Bazaar (ever!!) and Nativity Display. It was certainly impressive, both in terms of a fundraiser for the church, as well as an opportunity to welcome the community into our space. It was also my first set of Christmas services, which were well attended, including a first-for-us Christmas Carol sing-a-long. It was a special season to remember and celebrate the birth of Jesus.

With relationship building, with presence, with invitation, comes people who are interested to learn more, who are curious. Throughout 2019 we have welcomed some new people to our community and have continued to see many visitors and people coming to check us out.

#### Formation and Fun

Another major theme for me in 2019 at St. John's has been formation and fun! We kicked off September right by having a wonderful BBQ and bag blessing, continuing with Holy Cross Sunday, where people brought in crosses, a St. Francis pet blessing, and St. Michael and All Angels, with angel food cake! These all provided opportunities to invite people to church, and to deepen our own spiritual lives in a fun, participatory way.

The number of ministry groups that we offer during the week expanded in 2019, and provided a range of opportunities for people who come to St. John's on Sunday mornings, as well as those who don't, to connect with this community and with the Divine in life-giving ways. The weekly Discussion Group and monthly Men's Breakfast have continued to be well attended and lively opportunities for discussion and fellowship. Our new weekly prayer group has picked up a following, and is a meaningful moment of quiet and prayer on Thursday mornings. Our new weekly Ukulele Hymn Jam Group is a fun opportunity to make music together, and has even begun to be introduced to our Sunday morning worship. Our weekly labyrinth walk drop-in has not been well attended, but has been meaningful for those who come, and remains a wonderful time of quiet and meditation and Thursday evenings.

A big thank you to everyone who came out to the training mornings for leaders of the prayers of the people, servers and communion assistants, and readers; as well as to those who have offered their musical talents alongside our long-time faithful musician and pianist. I feel that this has helped us to continue to deepen our participation and engagement in the worship that we offer here every Sunday.

While no children came to our Advent Sunday School offering in 2019, we have laid the groundwork for children's ministry in 2020 and in the coming years. We have done this with the activity bags that we have made and assembled, the leaders who come forward to begin to be trained and equipped, and the grant we received from the diocese.

#### Wrapping Up and Looking Forward

If you have read this far, good for you! Pause for a moment. Take a deep breath. Consider this past year and the amazing things that have happened at St. John's. Well done, all you good and faithful servants. Give thanks to God for what our little community of Christ-followers has accomplished, with God's help.

Looking to the coming year, I hope that we can continue practicing and exploring the work of evangelism and invitation – telling our story to the people around us; sharing the good news of God in Christ – a message of love, inclusion, light and life. I hope that we can lean into mission and ministry, reaching out and serving this place where God has called us to be. I hope that we can continue to work to make this a place where families and young people feel welcome, connected, and aware of God's abiding love for them. I believe we can. I have faith in you. I have faith in God – the God who calls us onward.

#### The Rector's Warden Report ~ David Hildreth

Saying 2019 was an eventful year in the Parish life of St. John the Divine could be called a true understatement. Sharing some of the highlights of the past year is exciting.

On January 30<sup>th</sup> Pam, Trevor and myself met with Archbishop Melissa Skelton, Douglas Fenton, Executive Archdeacon and Stephen Muir, Archdeacon of Capilano, to request a full time Priest for our Parish. With Stephen Muir's guidance there evolved the creation of a Search Committee, which in turn developed a Parish Profile. With that approved, Her Grace recommended a candidate by the name of Cameron Gutjahr, and together with the search committee, a Skype interview, an in-person interview and with full agreement by all, as well as following all proper Diocese protocol, Cameron accepted the appointment. His Induction was memorable, well attended and most inspiring. Reverend Todd Townshend, who is now Bishop of Diocese of Huron, delivered the homily.

May 26<sup>th</sup> was Nick Parker's final Sunday before his retirement. Primate Fred Hiltz, who was also retiring, officiated at the service. In addition, Archbishop Melissa attended along with many other dignitaries; a true reflection of appreciation for Nick's 37 years as a Priest. Nick and Sandi were presented with a weekend trip to Whistler and a beautiful hand-crafted bench for their outdoor garden, by the parishioners.

St. John's was blessed with guest Priests until Cameron's arrival on July 1<sup>st</sup>. Gary Hamblin, Keith Gilbert and Stephen Muir conducted our Sunday services in the interim.

With Cameron's leadership commencing in July, the ensuing months have been most exciting. We now have weekly ukulele sessions, weekly study group gatherings and bible study reflections to name a few of the new and exciting programs that have been instigated. A most wonderful tradition that Cameron has begun at the beginning of the service gives everyone the opportunity to be present in the moment and to "Breathe in the love of God and breathe out our fears and pain until we are breathing out the love of God to the whole world". Powerful.

Further 2019 reflections and accomplishments that are worthy of mention.

- I. Exterior painting of the Church and Rectory. Because of parishioners support and a wonderful anonymous donation, no debt incurred
- New Church Hall doors installed and because of donations, no debt
- 3. Hiring of a property manager, to relieve Don Christie of the Rectory rent challenges. We acknowledge the wonderful work Don did in locating tenants, collecting rent and routine inspections etc.

- 4. Thanks to Pam for volunteering to prepare and submit a grant request. Our Parish was blessed with a \$9,000.00 Grant/Ministry Diocesan gift.
- 5. Many other happenings involving parishioners took place; special fund-raising events etc. That is what makes St. John's so special; everyone cares, shares and is involved. There is much laughter and fun.
- 6. On December 22<sup>nd</sup> there was a Christmas sing- along followed by mulled wine and refreshments in the church hall. Our Christmas Eve services were uplifting and special with a 4 p.m. Family Service and a 7 p.m. church Service. On Christmas Day there was a 10 a.m. church Service. Almost 150 people attended these 3 special services commemorating the birth of Christ.

Trevor Mills, our Peoples' Warden will not be continuing on in this capacity this year. Trevor has been most supportive of every activity for St. John's. He was involved in the search for a new Minister for our parish, he assisted in developing the Parish Profile, attended Priest interviews etc. It would require a complete page to list all of Trevor's' caring accomplishments. Let me sum up with, "God Bless you Trevor" as you pursue a lifetime dream of restoration of your rail car. Thank you for all you have done, and for agreeing to continue on with our web page updates and maintenance issues.

As I close, I would like to thank Cameron, Rita Carey and Don Christie, on behalf of the Parish, for their thought-provoking Stewardship updates and also thank several other parishioners for their thoughtful presentations. We ended 2019 in a wonderful financial position, and this has huge positive connotations as we continue our faith journey together.

Thank you for permitting me to be a Warden in this wonderful Parish, and we will, with God's help, continue to grow, share and celebrate our faith and as Cameron said, "Here we go!" Respectfully submitted.

#### Synod Delegate Report ~ Pam Tatterson

Synod 2019 May 24<sup>th</sup> and 25<sup>th</sup>

Theme: Love One Another

Friday May 24th

#### Table conversation 1: Love One Another, Christ's Body: the Church

Constitution and canons revision. Highlights available in tabular form, in advance.

- This was an update to regularize changes over almost 30 years. Address inconsistencies, gaps, duplication, outdated (lay reader), regulatory moved to regulations, consistent principles for decision-making authority in Parishes, Diocesan Council, Synod; removing provisions covered by Provincial or General Synod; establish broader processes for flexibility and fairness; update to current statutory and legal best practices (Age 21 changed to 18 for Vestry membership and Churchwarden appointment)
- Parish Organization: "Parish Council" for CC, "Associate Wardens" for deputies, "Search Committee" for Canonical, Priest in Charge (PIC) for Rector, Vicar, etc. PIC is chair of Parish Council.
  - Legal responsibility for the administration of parishes rests with PIC together with wardens and, if applicable, elected trustees.
- New Rules of Order: Kerr and King's Procedures for Meetings and Organizations, 3<sup>rd</sup> Ed
   Used by General Synod and recommended for Vestries and other Diocesan Committees.
- Substantial revision of Canon 18 governing the Board of Discipline: set-up, rules and procedures of the Diocesan Court to match current provincial, national and legal practices.

#### **Program Reports**

- PWRDF
- Sorrento Centre (.ca)
- Mission to Seafarers Peter Smith
- Treasurer Bob Hardy \$17.5M from sale of 4 properties in 2018 + other investments = \$70M total

#### Resolutions

- #2 Increase Anglican Initiatives Fund administrators from 5 to 7 that include Bish, Treas, Chancellor with 4 others elected for 3 terms max. (Because AIF now includes 4 other funds)
- #3 changes to AIF regulations must pass by 2/3 majority of 2 consecutive Synods.
- #4 parish operating receipts do not include flow-through funds such as PWRDF, Dc voluntary contributions, PD grants, curacy support or outside grants for the mission and ministry of parishes.
- #5 10% of funds from the sale of properties from Jan 1, 2018 onward will be allocated 5% to be "returned" to the indigenous peoples claiming title to the lands on which they sit, 2.5% to fund and endow indigenous justice, reconciliation and indigenous-led ministries in our diocese, 2.5% to support <u>self-determining indigenous Anglican Church within the Anglican Church of Canada.</u> (requested by indigenous groups consulting with the national church)

Sat., May 24

Morning Prayer with Homily by Fred Hiltz – the story of the honourable Bede

**Self-Determining Indigenous Church** – Fred Hiltz and Jerry Adams (Diocesan Indigenous Justice Coordinator)

- Discussion of the evolution of indigenous ministry within the national church, starting from 1 bishop, Mark MacDonald 25 years ago, growing to 12 in 5 northern provinces and territories.
- General Synod will honour the 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the 1994 covenant with the Council of Indigenous people to build an indigenous church within the Anglican Church of Canada
- The Anglican council of indigenous people will be able to determine their representatives, who will be full members of General Synod, and they will have some kind of constitution. Self-determination within the church is very important to this Council.
- The National Indigenous Bishop will become an Archbishop.
- Council of Elders vision-keepers who hold the church account to UN Declaration of Ind Rights

**Time with the Primate** - Table conversation 2: Affirmations passed by Council of General Synod

- Almost unanimously accepted by Synod floor, there were a very few same-sex concerns, and they were discussed without rancour. (The affirmations later passed as Resolution 7)
- Concerns were that there was no affirmation to live them out. No follow-through
- Same-sex "A05I-R2" amendment to Canon 21 (marriage) 1<sup>st</sup> reading in 2016 passed by 2/3 majority of lay, clergy and bishops at General Synod. It will be on the 2019 agenda, and if it passes by the required 2/3 of each group for the second time (doctrinal matters), it will become an Act of Synod. If not, it will be defeated.

**Property Development** – interesting presentation of possibilities by committee that includes Rob Dickson and Tellison Glover. They have resource packages that may be helpful to us one day.

#### **Program Reports**

- VST growing strong with Richard Topping
- VGH Chaplaincy Rev Bryan Rivers. Contact John Stephens if we wish to support

#### 2019 Budget and Vision Budgets 2020 and 2021

- All passed with only some discussion, no real controversy
- Diocesan Consolidated Trust Fund is a good place for us to invest (!)—low fees, large fund - good ROI
- \$200K extra expenses in 2020 anticipated from hosting Gen Synod 2019, \$400K extra in 2021 for episcopal succession election of new Bishop.

#### Resolutions

- Resolution 8 youth affirmation recognizing a climate emergency. Diocese will support
  all parish efforts to reduce emissions, and efforts to be documented in annual vestry
  reports. Amended to Include Thinstallation of 2 EV charging stations at the Synod office.
- Resolution 10 (2EV charge stations) withdrawn; 9 through 12 referred to Diocesan Council

#### Altar Guild Report ~ Eve Brealey

Thank you to the altar guild members, Alice Christie, Norma Lawton, Lou Rempel, Eve Brealey and Carol Cheal.

Thank you to Debbie Fryer for changing the liturgical wall hangings when needed.

The altar guild sets up the altar for communion, washes the linens and cleans the brass. The altar guild also makes sure there is an adequate supply of wine, grape juice, wafers, bread and candles.
