



Emergency Evacuation Drill

There will be an Emergency Evacuation Drill on Sunday, May 21, following the benediction at the end of each service of worship, weather permitting. This will be done as part of the Leading with Care Policy and as mandated by the Presbytery of Calgary-Macleod. We will follow an evacuation procedure that has been developed and reviewed with Session and the Church School.



Please familiarize yourselves with the nearest exit and be prepared to leave through that exit quickly and calmly. You will get direction from Worship Leaders and Shepherds to facilitate leaving the building. That Sunday at the time of the drill, all people will be required to leave the building. Those with limited mobility will gather on the lawn just out of the front doors of the building and there will be assistance for exiting if needed. If you have questions, please speak with Rev. Jan.
