**Public Speaking:** We (or I) were able to share in Campbell River, Courtenay, Parksville, Victoria, Quadra Island and in Vancouver at Faith and Collingwood. I was also able to share about the Christian virtue of Love at a local Sikh Temple.

**Teaching English**: Something which is new for me is assisting International Students with ESL. It has been very rewarding.

**Catherine**: Heavily involved in New Hope Child Care administration, programming, staff relations, liaison with the two churches in our building etc. She also has been a constant support for two of our daughters and their children, (seven grandchildren now!), Jonathan and of course myself.
