

Study Guide for August 15 2020 Sermon "Mary of Bethany: Humility, Sacrifice, Adoration"

Texts: Luke 10:38-42, John 12:1-8

- 1. When you think of the term "worship" what comes to mind first?
- 2. What are the distractions you struggle with and how do you deal with them?
- 3. Reflect on some of the ways and means by which help you to focus in general and on the Lord in particular.
- 4. Consider Matthew's account of Mary's anointing of Jesus (Matt. 26:6-13), specifically as He declares, "Wherever this gospel is preached in the whole world, what this woman has done will also be spoken of in memory of her."
- 5. Explore these principles of biblical worship: Humility, Sacrifice, Adoration. How are they revealed in Mary of Bethany in those few accounts we have of her (Lk. 10:38-42, Jn. 12:1-8; see also Jn. 11:28-32)?
- 6. By nature, are you a "Martha" or a "Mary"? Discuss the pros and cons of being a "Martha."
- 7. Mary, seated at Jesus' feet and listening to His Word, was paying attention, attuned to His impending Passion, even as His disciples mostly missed it. Active listening is a vital spiritual discipline—assess your own personal practice of listening "to hear what the Spirit is saying."
- 8. Satan exploits our low attention spans and addictions to technology to distract us from hearing the Good Shepherd's voice. Would you concur that there is a major spiritual warfare component tied to becoming "listeners"?
- 9. During the sermon I shared a bit about my wilderness wanderings these past five years re the <u>sin of presumption</u> I needed to repent of. Can you relate?
