WALK FOR SATURDAY NOVEMBER 12.

Peg, Pauline, Heather and I (Vicki) set off from McBride Park this morning, sent off with a blessing from Rev. Pitman and lovely packets, sandwiches, fresh fruit and a variety of clothes, supplied by Irene from St. Helen's. Thank you Irene! We were blessed with dry skies, at least at the beginning, a departure from what most teams have experienced this Fall.

We started our day down at Jericho, where E accepted everything we offered. On to M, at the hostel, who was in good spirits and was happy to receive packets, fresh food and a new sweater.

At the 4th and Highbury corner were T, M, W, W, B, B and a french fellow who was familiar, but we didn't catch his name. Heather noticed B's glasses were in disrepair, and has offered to help him get a new pair. Thank you Heather! B told us about C, who was homeless, then at Dunbar, then got a basement suite, and now is homeless again. He said he felt lonely living in the basement suite. This unfortunate story serves as a reminder of the value of companionship - on and off the streets - and reinforces to me the importance of our street ministry.

We headed east down Broadway and found D, a young man new to us, near London Drugs. He was happy to take all we offered, but wasn't interested in housing at this time, especially if it meant returning to the DTES. He's trying hard to stay clean.

On Granville were S and G, who were happy for the packets and especially fresh food.

We looped around to 4th avenue, and with our last packet and food, found P, the First Nations Megaphone seller who is almost always at the Whole Foods corner . P was honoured by his peers with the Vender of the Year award, and he proudly showed us the plaque. If you are by the Whole Foods, feel free to stop and congratulate him.

The four of us had a very good morning between street visits chatting about the street work we do, the new Mobile Care Unit project, etc.

In closing...can I ask that everyone put a call out to their churches/friends for winter wear. In particular, warm, waterproof gloves, fleece tops and bottoms, long underwear, rain gear. Thank you so much! *Vicki*

A REPORT FROM THE FINANCE COMMITTEE

Total revenue for St Philips through end of September is \$331K, slightly ahead versus budget and year ago. Receipts from identified givers (pledges) are slightly behind budget (-2%). Improved rental income and increased weddings and funerals have helped make up the difference.

Despite significant staff change and building maintenance costs incurred, expenses through September have been well managed by clergy, staff and committees, coming in 6% below budget. We have also benefited from a rebate in the amount we submit to the diocese, which has the bottom line deficit shrinking from a budgeted - \$55k (through Sept.), to the actual of -\$ 24k. If identified givers revenues finish the year as forecast, and costs continue to be well managed, we anticipate a year end deficit of - \$14k.

It is important to note that the parish did approve a budget with an operating loss of \$34k, and we have done well to shrink that loss, but we must continue to manage cost and achieve our forecasted revenues in order to minimize the use of parish investments to bridge the deficit gap.

PARISH WEEKLY INCOME UPDATE

- 2016 operating budget revenues are \$470,114 in the approved parish budget
- 72% of operating budget revenues (\$338,284) is expected from identified givers
- Based on 2016 pledges, we expect an average of \$6,505 per Sunday from identified givers
- At the end of October we had averaged \$5,980 per Sunday from identified givers.
- Last Sunday we received \$5,107.
