**October 28- 30TH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME, Year B:**  
**God wants to heal the broken places in our life.**

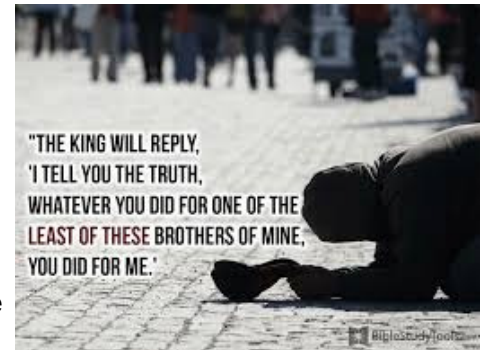
It is easy for us to be dismissive about miracles of healing, to place our trust in medicine and disregard God's role in healing. Until it isn't. Major physical health crises, mental health challenges, debilitating encounters with our own sinfulness, and the injuries inflicted on us – these can all bring us face to face with our need for healing. The question is will we be like the beggar and cry out for it, or persist in our denial that we need healing? Trauma, fear, sinful habits, physical pain or disease – God can use our brokenness, and He wants us to be healed and whole.

Our part is to ask, to insist, that we have faith in God's healing, and to trust He will give us the healing He needs for us to serve Him well.



**November 4 – 31st Sunday in ORDINARY TIME, Year B:**  
**How well are we loving the least of God's people?**

When Jesus says there are two greatest commandments (loving God and then loving our neighbour), he insists that the way we love each other is a key way in which we love him. Put another way on another occasion, Jesus said whatever we do to the least of our brothers and sisters, we do to him. When we stand before God to make an account of our lives as pro-life people, we will not only be asked if we prevented people from dying. We will also be asked how well we nurtured and cared for the quality of life of the least among us. How often do we sacrifice from our own need to share with the hungry? How are we doing in extending compassion to those in prison? Are we irritated or moved by the homeless?

## Portions of MESSAGE OF HIS HOLINESS FRANCIS (to the Youth) leading up to Oct , 2018 "Youth Synod"

### FOR WORLD MISSION DAY 2018 - Together with young people, let us bring the Gospel to all

Dear young people, I would like to reflect with you on the mission that we have received from Christ. In speaking to you, I also address all Christians who live out in the Church the adventure of their life as children of God. What leads me to speak to everyone through this conversation with you is the certainty that the Christian faith remains ever young when it is open to the mission that Christ entrusts to us. **"Mission revitalizes faith"** (*Redemptoris Missio*, 2), in the words of Saint John Paul II, a Pope who showed such great love and concern for young people. The Synod to be held in Rome this coming October... offers us an opportunity to understand more fully... what the Lord Jesus wants to say to you young people, and, through you, to all Christian communities.

**Life is a mission** Every man and woman is a mission; that is the reason for our life on this earth. .... More than anyone else, young people feel the power of life breaking in upon us and attracting us. To live out joyfully our responsibility for the world is a great challenge. I am well aware of lights and shadows of youth...The fact that we are not in this world by our own choice makes us sense that there is an initiative that precedes us and makes us exist. Each one of us is called to reflect on this fact: **"I am a mission on this Earth; that is the reason why I am here in this world"** (*Evangelii Gaudium*, 273).

**We proclaim Jesus Christ** The Church, by proclaiming what she freely received (cf. *Mt 10:8*; *Acts 3:6*), can share with you young people the way and truth which give meaning to our life on this earth. ... Dear young people, do not be afraid of Christ and his Church! For there we find the treasure that fills life with joy.

**Transmitting the faith to the ends of the earth** You too, young friends, by your baptism have become living members of the Church; together we have received the mission to bring the Gospel to everyone. ... the freshness and enthusiasm of the young makes them a source of support and hope for those nearing the end of their journey. In this blend of different stages in life, the mission of the Church bridges the generations; our faith in God and our love of neighbor are a source of profound unity. The ends of the earth, dear young people, nowadays are quite relative and always easily "navigable". The digital world – the social networks that are so pervasive and readily available ... Everything appears within reach, so close and immediate. And yet lacking the sincere gift of our lives, we could well have countless contacts but never share in a true communion of life. To share in the mission to the ends of the earth demands the gift of oneself in the vocation that God, who has placed us on this earth, chooses to give us (cf. *Lk 9:23-25*). I dare say that, for a young man or woman who wants to follow Christ, what is most essential is to seek, to discover and to persevere in his or her vocation. ...

Dear young people, this coming October, the month of the missions, we will hold the Synod devoted to you. It will prove to be one more occasion to help us become missionary disciples, ever more passionately devoted to Jesus and his mission, to the ends of the earth. I ask Mary, Queen of the Apostles, Saint Francis Xavier, Saint Thérèse of the Child Jesus and Blessed Paolo Manna to intercede for all of us and to accompany us always.

We are all called to be saints, and if we open our lives to the working of God's grace, He will bring that call to fulfillment in us. Saint Nunzio teaches us that God leads us along the path to sanctity by offering us daily opportunities to rely solely upon Divine Providence, to offer our own concrete circumstances -- both sufferings and joys -- to Him, and to die to ourselves in order to be of service to others."

## Catholic Moral Teaching Discussed at Youth Synod

### 'Watering down' Church teaching won't attract young, cardinal says

Just because some young people disagree with Catholic moral teaching, including in the area of sexuality, does not mean the church's teachings are unclear or should change, Cardinal Robert Sarah told the Synod of Bishops. The church and its pastors should "courageously propose the Christian ideal corresponding to Catholic moral doctrine and not water it down, hiding the truth to attract young people to the bosom of the church," the cardinal told bishops meeting at the (October) synod at the Vatican.
