SERMON: Love One Another Self-Sacrificially

John 13:21-38 (CSB)

Judas's Betrayal Predicted

21 When Jesus had said this, he was troubled in his spirit and testified, "Truly I tell you, one of you will betray me."

22 The disciples started looking at one another — uncertain which one he was speaking about. 23 One of his disciples, the one Jesus loved, was reclining close beside Jesus. 24 Simon Peter motioned to him to find out who it was he was talking about. 25 So he leaned back against Jesus and asked him, "Lord, who is it?"

26 Jesus replied, "He's the one I give the piece of bread to after I have dipped it." When he had dipped the bread, he gave it to Judas, Simon Iscariot's son. 27 After Judas ate the piece of bread, Satan entered him. So Jesus told him, "What you're doing, do quickly."

28 None of those reclining at the table knew why he said this to him. 29 Since Judas kept the money-bag, some thought that Jesus was telling him, "Buy what we need for the festival," or that he should give something to the poor. 30 After receiving the piece of bread, he immediately left. 31 When he had left, Jesus said, "Now the Son of Man is glorified, and God is glorified in him. 32 If God is glorified in him, God will also glorify him in himself and will glorify him at once.

33 Little children, I am with you a little while longer. You will look for me, and just as I told the Jews, so now I tell you, 'Where I am going, you cannot come.'

34 "I give you a new command: Love one another. Just as I have loved you, you are also to love one another. 35 By this everyone will know that you are my disciples, if you love one another."

Peter's Denials Predicted

36 "Lord," Simon Peter said to him, "where are you going?"

Jesus answered, "Where I am going you cannot follow me now, but you will follow later."

37 "Lord," Peter asked, "why can't I follow you now? I will lay down my life for you."

38 Jesus replied, "Will you lay down your life for me? Truly I tell you, a rooster will not crow until you have denied me three times. -- John 13:21-38 (CSB)


DISCUSSION QUESTIONS

- What are some examples of self-sacrificial love people have shown you, or you have seen in others?
- Are there people you would feel comfortable to share doubts or questions you have about the Christian faith with? If there are, what is it about those people that makes you feel comfortable about that?
- How can you assess whether a disciple who has failed has repented?
- How can a repentant disciple know if or when they've been forgiven? And restored?

• In our society, when people have failed, they may be required to spend time in the "sin bin" before they are restored. For example, a government minister who fails may need to spend a term or two on the backbench before being given responsibilities again. On the other hand, Jesus restored Peter pretty promptly in John 21 – but he was Jesus, and he knew Peter's heart. What's appropriate in the church – restore promptly, or wait a period of time? Either way - why? And if we decide to wait – how long for, and who decides?

• When is it appropriate to warn people about a restored disciple's previous failure, and when is it a black mark inhibiting restoration? How do you assess this?

DISCIPLESHIP DIGEST



There has been a new concept floating around Christian circles of late which I love. It is called "Own your input". Own your input is about taking responsibility for the content we consume both online and in the media. Scripture teaches us that we are shaped by what we tend to think about. Romans 12, teaches us that since we have been redeemed by Jesus, we need to be transformed by the renewing of our minds. Philippians 4:8 specifically commands us to think about things that are noble, right, pure, lovely, admirable, excellent or praiseworthy. The obvious implication is that we should NOT think about things that are ignoble, wrong, impure and so forth. Owning your input is about putting this in practice in today's day and age. So over the next several weeks I am going to be sharing things I consider to be excellent input, things that we would be proud to own as our input.

Today I want to highlight a movie that is coming to Netflix.

This film follows the life of Saul of Tarsus, while he is still persecuting Christians, through his conversion, and then on to his life as the Apostle Paul. This movie is rated M for mature, because it

doesn't hide the truth of the persecution Christians faced. At the same time the movie is not nearly as gory as "The Passion of the Christ", which also stars Jim Caviezel.

The film is clearly a Hollywood adaptation of a true biblical account, and creative licence has been taken in putting the script together. Never the less, this movie helps us appreciate the persecution that happened in the early church, the strength of conviction they would have needed to convert to Christianity, and the earnestness with which Paul sought to spread the gospel.

This movie will be available to stream on Netflix from October the 4th.



Face to Face draws from the rich history and experience of Walk to Emmaus.


Walk to Emmaus is an adaptation of the Roman Catholic Cursillo (pronounced cur-SEE-o) Movement, which originated in Spain in 1949.

Cursillo de Cristianidad means "little course in Christianity." The original Cursillo leaders designed the program to empower persons to transform their living and working environments into

Christian ones. During the 1960s and 1970s, the Episcopalians and Lutherans, along with several nondenominational groups, such as Tres Dias, began to offer Cursillo. In 1978, The Upper Room of the General Board of Discipleship adapted the program for a primarily Protestant audience and began to offer the program under the name The Upper Room Cursillo. In 1981, The Upper Room made further adaptations and changed the name of the program to The Upper Room Walk to Emmaus. In 1984, The Upper Room developed a youth expression of Emmaus called Chrysalis.

The Emmaus family of programs continues to grow with new and updated ministries that Seek to empower leaders to be the hands and feet of Christ.


A scientific deconstruction of the theory of evolution

Finding alternative sources of income has been virtually impossible for some of the pastors. – Open Doors

Give praise for the continuing work of the Holy Spirit. An ISIS leader has come to faith in Christ after tuning to Christian satellite TV in the Middle East. After viewing the Leading The Way program, Mohammad*, at first decided to contact Peter, a follow-up counsellor, to kill him. (Names have been changed for security). But through a dream about Jesus, Mohammad's life was dramatically turned around. Following a second meeting with Peter, Mohammad surrendered his life to Jesus. He told Peter that the first time they met he had a knife in his pocket and wanted to kill him, but something prevented him. It was revealed that Mohammad was in fact a Prince of ISIS who other people would pledge allegiance to and die for. ASSIST News reports that countless viewers are responding to the broadcasts with many accepting Christ. Leading The Way's field teams are ready around the clock to answer questions and share the Gospel. – ASSIST News Service
