The thrift store has had a busy and successful summer. Below is a summary of the statistics:

June – Sales \$5385.55, Customers 458 and Volunteer Hours 238.75 July – Sales \$5625.20, Customers 508 and Volunteer Hours 242.25 August – Sales \$5871.45, Customers 520 and Volunteer Hours 262.75

We had two meetings over the summer – one on July 19th and one on September 6th – the minutes are attached.

Highlights:

- We hosted the Lodge on July 20th they did some shopping and we had coffee and snacks
- We had a customer appreciation BBQ on August 11th served 100 customers and raised \$279.05 for the school lunch program
- We were closed the Saturdays of the long weekends so our volunteers could enjoy the summer We had a volunteer appreciation supper at Jean Curry's in June we had a great time!
- We have purchased a lamppost in memory of Leroy Lausen that we will be installing at the community garden.
- We are working on getting a new outdoor sign made.
- Met with M&P to go over job description for thrift store manager and hiring contract. It was agreed upon and the position will be reviewed in October once the 6 month trial period is over.
- We had numerous sales red and white Canada Day sale, summer clearance, back to school sale, storewide flash sale as well as weekly specials
- Manager did quite a bit of coverage at other jobs (church office and bank) but the volunteers covered as needed and it worked well. Our volunteers are amazing (3) We had a few new volunteers come on board.
- We will be doing a pricing review this next month not looking at increasing prices but expanding our listing and making sure signage and pricing consistent.
- Our 5 year anniversary is coming up in November talked about a few ideas of how to celebrate with volunteers and in store.
- Donations have been steady but have been able to keep up due to extra day open. Our shed is just about full for
 the rummage sale and the other shed for the Diabetic Association has about 250 bags to be sent. We sponsored
 2 kids to go to Bar Harbour Camp. We have made lots of donations to groups of items including the museum,
 school, Mustard Seed, women's shelter, Victim Services, nursing home, lodge etc. We also are donating funds to
 various organizations in motions below.
