- Stepping out in faith should be discerned in a faith community

DISCUSSION

2. Can you share about a time when you distinctly “heard” the voice of God?

3. Can you share about a time when you tried to intuitively respond to the Holy Spirit?

4. Read Acts 1:21-26. Does it make sense to cast lots these days to determine the will of God in our lives? Why? Why not?

5. Read Acts 2:14-21. Does God still speak to us in dreams and visions? What are the differences between dreams and visions? How can we determine if a dream or a vision is from God?

APPLICATION

6. Seek out somebody in your life who has spoken about God to you or spoke God’s truth to you – and tell them what that’s meant to you.

7. Do a Holy Spirit experiment this week: pray for sensitivity to the Spirit, listen with expectancy, be mindful of the discernment provisos, and respond to what you sense the Spirit of God is telling you.
