Week of Mar 3, 2019 — Focus: Mark 4:35-41

Introduction/Ice-breaker

This current sermon series is built around the idea of our view of Jesus coming into *focus* more and more. As an intro to the discussion, can anyone share an experience where they *thought* they knew someone (preconceived notions, surface judgement, believing other's opinions, etc) and then truly got to know them in a completely different light?

Scripture/Sermon Discussion

In speaking to the context of this passage, Pastor Joshua pointed to Mark 1:1; 2:5-7; 3:5, and then in this passage, 4:39-41.

- What do these verses show us about Jesus overall?
- · What do they show us about Jesus specifically?

Re-read Mark 4:35-41 as a group.

- What was Jesus doing prior to this experience on the boat?
- Why would he *leave* the crowd (v. 36)? Who was he with now?
- Why would Jesus be sleeping / stay asleep in a storm? What are the possibilities? (See Psalm 4:8, Ecclesiastes 5:12)
- What was the problem with the disciples questioning of Jesus? What does this say about their belief about him?
- What do you think is the overall point of this account? Why would Mark include it in his gospel?

Great: Wind, Calm, Fear

• Pastor Joshua noted the repetition of the word "great" in 4:37, 39, 41 (ESV) as it related to the windstorm, the calm, and the disciples' fear. What can we learn from this as it relates to Jesus? In other words, how great is *he*?

Fear

- How did the disciples' fear shift from 4:38 to 4:41?
- Should we fear Jesus just as the disciples did? Why or why not? (See also: 1 Jn 4:18, Isaiah 6:1-5)

Application

View of Jesus

Mark stated who Jesus was at the beginning of his Gospel (1:1). After that point, he paints a picture of who Jesus is and shows the various responses to him (recall the various soils of 4:1-20). This week's passage ends with a question, "Who then is this?" The answer is somewhat obvious to us by now: Jesus is God Almighty—our good and powerful God. The bigger question is, do you believe it?

 How does your life speak to your level of belief in God's goodness and God's power? Cite specific examples.

Storms of Life

What "storms" have there been in your life? Are you going through a storm right now?

- Have you brought this to Jesus in prayer?
- If so, is your response more like the leper in 1:40 or the disciples in 4:38?
- How can that change? Bring up suggestions within the group for how to grow in our trust of God.
- Can the group support you in any way?

Prayer

- Pray for a greater awareness of God's goodness and power in your lives
- Pray for the specific "storms" that each other are facing. Ask for God's goodness and power to be made evident in them and for his kingdom to grow through them
- Pray that our church and people of Maple Ridge would see Jesus clearly (for eyes of faith)
