The Power of Stories

Over the last few months on Tuesday nights, we have had an opportunity to hear some people tell their stories: Fred Mahler, Else Svendsen, and Mike Lickers. Without their stories, we might just *"know them"* as a guy that sings in the choir, a woman who comes to Wednesday morning Bible Study, and a guy that

works at Suncor. For those of us who were here to hear their stories, we traveled with them through their stories to Poland, Denmark, France & Canada. We journeyed with them through world wars and residential schools. We empathized with them for their losses and rejoiced with them in their triumphs over adversity and challenge.

Something as simple as listening to their story has profoundly changed the way each of us "know" these people and who they are.

I'm always a little surprised by the worlds that open up when we take time to listen to other peoples' stories... But I shouldn't be!

As Christians (along with Jews and to a great extent Muslims), we are *People of the Book*. We look to the Bible as the inspired Word of God and as the source and authoritative standard for our faith and life together. But



if we really want to be accurate, we are really people of *The Story*.

Most of the Bible was transmitted orally for hundreds of years. Even the Gospels were told orally for 20-30 years before they were written down.

Fred Mahler In the Bible we encounter the

- how God gathered a people who claim Abraham as
- their father;
- how they journeyed to a new land;

- how they sojourned in Egypt;
- how they were brought to the promised land and trained as God's people along the way;
- how they became united, divided, conquered, exiled and restored.

The story continues with the incarnation of God in Jesus; his life, death, resurrection;, and the embodiment of Christ in the Church.

On one hand, this is something that you know. On the other hand, we live in a society and culture that tends to be focused on what

people *do.* I know for myself, I tend to get into *task mode* and my focus is just on getting things done. When I am in this mode, taking time to be with people and listen to their stories occur as *inefficient* and as an *impediment* to getting things done! These are times when I have lost who I am!

Through baptism, we become part of God's story... A story of God's love for the world that the Bible has been telling for over 3000 years. When we find *our place* in God's story, we know who we are as beloved children of God and a way to be in the world.

When we spend time telling and retelling the stories of God's love for the world, we remind ourselves of who and whose we are.

When we spend time hearing each other's stories, we grow closer as a community journeying together as God's people.

When we take to time to hear a stranger's story, the stranger becomes a neighbour.

Few if any men have changed the course of history like Martin Luther. In less than ten years, this fevered German monk plunged a knife into the heart of an empire that had ruled for a thousand years, and set in motion a train of revolution, war and conflict that would reshape Western civilization, and lift it out of the Dark Ages.

Luther's is a drama that still resonates half a millennium on. It's an epic tale that stretches from the gilded corridors of the Vatican to the weathered church door of a small South German town; from the barbarous pyres of heretics to the technological triumph of printing. It is the story of the birth of the modern age, of the collapse of medieval feudalism, and the first shaping of ideals of freedom and liberty that lie at the heart of the 21st century.

But this is also an intensely human tale, a story that hurtles from the depths of despair to the heights of triumph and back again. This is the story of a man who ultimately found himself a lightning conductor of history, crackling with forces he could not quite comprehend or control.

Palm Sunday worship 10 am Matthew 21:1-17 Jesus arrives in Jerusalem. Please bring coats and sweaters that you would like to donate to the Drop-In Centre with you to worship.


Holy Monday Scripture &

Prayer 9 am Matthew 21:18 – 23:39 Jesus teaches in the Temple.

Holy Tuesday Scripture &

Prayer 9 am Matthew 24:1 – 26:5

Jesus laments over Jerusalem and speaks and tells parables about the end of the age.



Holy Wednesday Scripture & Prayer 9 am Matthew 26:6-16 Jesus in the home of Simon the leper.

Maundy Thursday worship 7:30 pm Matthew 26:17-75 Jesus eats the Passover with his friends. As they pray in the garden after the meal, Jesus is betrayed and taken before Caiaphas, the High Priest. Peter denies knowing him.

Good Friday worship 10 am Matthew 27:1-66 Jesus is tried, condemned and crucified. Also, our prayer vigil (*sponsored by Prayer and Care*) begins today. Be part of the continuous prayer vigil lasting from the time of Jesus' death until sunrise Easter morning. Pray at church or wherever you are. The staff will provide a prayer booklet and prayer concerns to aid you. Sign up in the narthex, or by phoning the church office.

Holy Saturday worship at 8:33 pm Sabbath Day: The Word is silent. When the Sabbath ends, the community gathers to keep vigil. They tell stories of God's saving acts, looking to God with hope for deliverance now.

Prayer Vigil





Message from Our Bishop

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ -

Ho, everyone who thirsts, come to the waters; and you that have no money, come, buy and eat! Come, buy wine and milk without money and without price. Why do you spend your money for that which is not bread, and your labour for that which does not satisfy? Isaiah 55:1-2a

My Lenten devotions this year have been in part focused on a set of compiled writings from Old Testament scholar, Walter Brueggemann: A Way other than Our Own: Devotions for Lent.

I have always found Brueggemann's writings to be thought-provoking, insightful and challenging. Perhaps, since it is the season of Lent and I am "open" in the season, I have found this compilation to be even more thought-provoking, even more insightful and even more challenging.

Reflecting on Isaiah 55:1-2a: Lent is a question. Lent is a gift. Lent is a summons.

The questions of Lent Brueggemann suggests are: What are we doing? Are we working for that which does not satisfy? Are we spending for that which is not bread?

Thought-provoking.

The gifts of Lent are free, gifts in the gospel that sustain life. Free wine and milk. Free water and bread, and "all the markings of sacrament that refuse our thin attempts at empire" (pg. 11).

Insightful.

And challenging: The summons of Lent is to bear new fruit. To do what is in sync, in harmony, with the God of the good news, the God who has another intention for our lives, who wants us out of the rat-race of "big is better", "highest salary means most valuable", "the one with the most toys wins" and so has mercy, who gives us pardon when we do not do enough by doing two things at once.

We are left, dear sisters and brothers, with "a new sense of ourselves as God's people: no longer working for that which does not satisfy; receiving good gifts that we need for life; engaging in a new productivity of that which heals and transforms" (pg. 11).

The Lenten question, gift and summons.




