NEIGHBOURHOOD MINISTRY

Thanks so much to everybody for all of their donations of winter clothing to the Neighbourhood MInistry. It is a cold and wet time of the year to be living on the streets and the clothes have been very well received. We are still looking for sleeping bags, sleeping mats, blankets, rain pants and boots. We are also interested in receiving Ensure, canned meat and fruit cups. The following is a summary of the activities of the Westside Anglicans Neighbourhood Ministry from the last two weeks, including highlights from our Saturday Street Outreach teams and our Mobile Care Unit (MCU).

Over the course of the last weeks of December, the MCU social service teams visiting St. Augustine's, Kits Showers and M. Mitchell Place served a total of 15 clients, while the medical side a few clients for various concerns. The Street Teams made 45 connections over the last three Saturdays in December. On December 22, the Neighbourhood Ministry held a day of Christmas festivities. It started at St, Anselm's, when and where about 25 volunteers gathered to stuff care packets, then they hit the streets to deliver them to our friends on the street. Following that, another 20 or so volunteers (some overlap) went to the Dunbar Supportive Housing building, where volunteers prepared and served a luncheon with turkey, and caroled the residents.

SEXUAL MISCONDUCT POLICY TRAINING

Some of you may be aware that the Diocese requires all members of certain groups to be familiar with the Diocese of New Westminster's Sexual Misconduct Policy. This requires renewal every 5 years. The training is approximately 2 hours long (including a short video).

Medium Risk Ministries are those ministries where duties and responsibilities that "permit few chances for a person to be alone with a child or vulnerable adult, or permit some access to moderate amounts of financial resources or confidential information. People in these ministries are in a position of authority and trust".

High Risk Ministries are those that "permit opportunities for a person to be alone with a child or vulnerable adult or permit access to significant amounts of financial resources or sensitive and confidential information. These ministries are positions of authority or are positions that allow a person to establish long-term relationships of trust. All residential or off-site ministries with children or vulnerable adults are always ranked high risk".

The following ministries have been ranked medium or high risk, and all members must complete this training: Pastoral Care Team; Church School Coordinator and Teachers; Property Committee; Christian Formation; Finance Committee; Counting Team; Neighbourhood Ministry; Stewardship; Envelope Secretary; Endowment Fund Board; Server instructor; Youth Leader; Music Director; Church Committee; Trustees; Wardens; Treasurer; Outreach; Refugee Sponsorship.

If you belong to one (or more) of these groups, and have not completed the training in the last 5 years, please ensure that you attend one of the sessions. The next training session will be held on **Sunday January 27**, from **12.30-3pm at St Mary's Kerrisdale**.
