New in the James Bay United Church library this week What Do You Buy the Children of the Terrorist Who Tried to Kill Your Wife, A Memoir by David Harris-Gershon. In 2002, Jamie Harris Gershon was seriously injured when a bomb exploded at Hebrew University in Jerusalem. She suffered burns over 30% of her body, and the two friends with whom she was sitting were killed. The first half of this book explores the physical wounds that healed and the psychic wounds that did not. The catalyst for the journey to reconciliation was the author's discovery that the man responsible for planting the bomb in the cafeteria was the only member of his Hamas cell to express remorse to his Israeli interrogators. The terrorist had a name. He is, Harris-Gershon realizes, a human being. This leads to a reexamination of the historical narrative he had been taught and to considering for the first time the Palestinian narrative as well. Ironically, he came to re-think Palestinian humanity because he was directly affected by Palestinian terror.
