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EMMAUS COMMUNITY

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Welcome to Compline with the Emmaus Community!

The ancient office of Compline derives its name from a Latin word meaning 'completion' (*completorium*). It is above all a service of quietness and reflection before rest at the end of the day.

The service consists primarily of sung prayers and hymns, interspersed with spoken prayers and a reading from scripture. Unfortunately, congregational singing is not currently permitted due to COVID-19.

Please leave the singing to the choir. Instead, we invite you to participate by reading spoken parts **in bold**. We look forward to singing with you at a later date.

At times you may notice people around you bowing, kneeling, standing, etc. These physical gestures are meant to engage our bodies in the act of prayer. You are invited join in (see *italicized* directions below) but please feel welcome to simply pray in stillness if that is your preference.

The language for this worship is derived from *The Book of Common Prayer* (1662). In some places, we have adapted the language to reflect a wider inclusivity and changes in language since that time. Elsewhere we have retained the language of the original text.

We acknowledge with humility that we worship on the unceded lands of the Songhees and Esquimalt people. We recognize the Church's complicity and participation in the residential school system and commit ourselves to the ongoing work of restorative justice, healing, and decolonization.

Prayers & Final Responses

<u>Night Prayer – from A New Zealand Prayer Book</u>

Lord. it is night. The night is for stillness. Let us be still in the presence of God. It is night after a long day. What has been done has been done; what has not been done has not been done: let it be. The night is dark. Let our fears of the darkness of the world and of our own lives rest in you. The night is quiet. Let the quietness of your peace enfold us. all dear to us. and all who have no peace. The night heralds the dawn. Let us look expectantly to a new day, new joys, new possibilities. In your name we pray. Amen.

One or more of the following prayers may be said: Look down, O Lord, from thy heavenly throne, illuminate the darkness of this night with thy celestial brightness, and from the sons of light banish the deeds of darkness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.** Be present, O merciful God, and protect us through the silent hours of this night, so that we who are wearied by the changes and chances of this fleeting world, may repose upon thy eternal changelessness; through Jesus Christ our Lord. **Amen.**

Final Responses

*Choir:*We will lay us down in peace and take our rest* For it is thou Lord only that makest us dwell in safety.

The Lord be with you; * And with thy spirit.

Let us bless the Lord; * Thanks be to God.

Officiant: Almighty and Merciful God, Source of all Being, Eternal Word, and Holy Spirit, bless and preserve us. **Amen.**
