Prayers of gratitude may be offered. An extemporaneous closing may be offered.

Pentence

Let me hear of your loving-kindness in the morning, for I put my trust in you; show me the road that I must walk, for I lift up my soul to you. Psalm 143.8

Let us confess our sins against God and our neighbour.

Bell / Silence / Bell

[saying together] God of all mercy, we confess that we have sinned against you, opposing your will in our lives. We have denied your goodness in each other, in ourselves and in the world you have created. We repent of the evil that enslaves us, the evil we have done and the evil done on our behalf. Forgive, restore and strengthen us through our Saviour Jesus Christ, so that we may abide in your love and serve only your will. Amen.

Absolution or assurance of grace.

Opening Words (said or chanted) Lord, open our lips and our mouth shall proclaim your praise. Send your Holy Spirit upon us, and clothe us with power from on high. Alleluia. Blessed are you, creator God, to you be praise and glory for ever. As your Spirit moved over the face of the waters bringing light and life to your creation, pour out your Spirit on us today so that we may walk as children of light and by your grace reveal your presence.

Blessed be God: Source of all being, eternal Word and Holy Spirit. **Blessed be God for ever.**

A Hymn, A Poem or A Song

The Psalm of the Day

Ending with: Glory to You, Source of all being, eternal Word and Holy Spirit As it was in the beginning, is now, and ever shall be World without end, Amen.

Affirmation of Faith One of the following Affirmations of Faith may be said,.

The Apostles' Creed I believe in God, the Father almighty, creator of heaven and earth. I believe in Jesus Christ, God's only Son, our Lord, who was conceived by the Holy Spirit, born of the virgin Mary, suffered under Pontius Pilate, was crucified, died, and was buried; he descended to the dead. On the third day he rose again; he ascended into heaven, he is seated at the right hand of the Father, and he will come again to judge the living and the dead. I believe in the Holy Spirit, the holy catholic church, the communion of saints, the forgiveness of sins, +the resurrection of the body, and the life everlasting. Amen.³
