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Music Notes | The Coventry Cross of Nails

STEPHEN WRIGHT, *Christ Church Cathedral Choir member*

Eighty years ago, on the night of November 14/15, 1940, the city of Coventry and its Cathedral Church burned. The following morning local priest Rev. Arthur Wales picked up several medieval nails in the ruins of the still-smouldering Cathedral and fashioned them into a cross. The *Coventry Cross of Nails* has come to symbolize the international ministry of forgiveness and reconciliation embodied by the Coventry Cathedral complex of old ruins and adjacent modern structure. Such a cross has been presented to like-minded organizations, resulting in 1973 in the Community of the Cross of Nails (of which Christ Church Cathedral is a member).

Our music today includes works either directly linked with Coventry or by composers from the warring nations. Commissioned for the rebuilt Cathedral's consecration in 1962, Benjamin Britten's *War Requiem* is a powerful anti-war statement. Although a large-scale work, its *Kyrie* is concise enough to serve as our Introit.

In February 1945, Dresden was reduced to ruins in an allied bombing raid which is still controversial. The city was twinned with Coventry in 1959, and there are four crosses of nails in Dresden. Heinrich Schütz was court composer to the Elector of Saxony in Dresden during the very different but equally destructive Thirty-Years War (1618–1648).

Russian-born Dmitry Bortniansky studied in Italy before being appointed Director of the Imperial Court Chapel at St. Petersburg in 1801. As such his works had enormous influence on the course of church

music in 19th century Russia.

Although not completed until 1947, Maurice Duruflé began composing his *Requiem* in 1941 to a commission from the Vichy Regime. Dedicated to the memory of his father, the thematic material is mostly derived from the Gregorian Mass for the Dead.

As chairman of the Canadian College of Organists, Healey Willan was instrumental in raising funds from Canadian choirs and organists which in large part paid for the organ in the new Cathedral. Continuing this link, the current Director of Music at Coventry is Canadian Rachel Mahon.

In 1958 Canon Joseph Poole, first precentor of the new Coventry Cathedral, wrote the *Litany of Reconciliation* based on the seven cardinal sins. The Litany takes as its refrain "Father, forgive," rather than Jesus' familiar "Father, forgive them," acknowledging the universality of human guilt; it is recited each Friday at noon before the altar of the ruined Cathedral. The Arvo Pärt-inspired setting of these words was composed by this author in 1994.

Today also marks the 100th anniversary of the first complete public performance of Gustav Holst's orchestral suite *The Planets* (November 15, 1920). The following year he adapted the main theme from the *Jupiter* movement in setting the text *I Vow to Thee, My Country*, since sung on many state occasions including the funeral of Winston Churchill in 1965.
