Dear lovely people of St Philip's!

This week we say a fond farewell to our lovely Beth as she sets off to pastures new. She will be joining Richmond Food Bank as their full-time Office Manager and we wish her the very best as she begins this important new journey in her life. Because of COVID-19 we are unable to say goodbye in our normal way, but we will include a leaving 'do' in this Sunday's online worship service. If you would like to contribute to Beth's farewell purse, a St Philip's tradition, the details of how to do so are given below.

We are actively seeking Beth's replacement, but in the interim Pat (yes, you guessed it) has offered to step in to take on much of what the Parish Manager does in the interim. You may recall that Pat came to us after being the Front of House Manager at Stong's, so she has plenty of experience in this area. Thank you, Pat once again for your support and enthusiasm - what would we do without you!

As you know, following Dr Bonnie Henry's announcement of tighter COVID-19 restrictions until the 23rd November, the Diocese asked each parish to decide locally whether or not to suspend in-person worship. After consulting with the Wardens, I decided to err on the side of caution and suspend in-person worship until Advent Sunday Nov. 29. I know some people were disappointed with my decision and I accept that. However, as COVID-19 number spiral I believe it is important to be seen to do our bit to help Dr Henry's efforts by lessening contact as we can. I also want to protect your welfare and prioritise your safety. Hence my decision.

In a meeting with the clergy of the Diocese this week, Archbishop Melissa warned that we need to 'be ready for any possible scenario' in the coming weeks as the coronavirus numbers continue to increase. She said she would take her lead from Dr Henry and would put the Diocese back into whatever phase of re-opening is deemed appropriate. She re-iterated the need for all in the Diocese to take leadership within our communities by maintaining our social distancing and wearing masks to keep each other safe.

I will keep you informed as new information comes in, but for now our next in-person service will be a wonderful Advent Service of music and readings at 4.30pm on Advent Sunday, 29th November.

'Being ready' is part of the spiritual make-up of the Christian life. Jesus constantly told his hearers that we would not know when the Kingdom of God would appear. The writer of Thessalonians also makes the point, 'For you yourselves know very well that the day of the Lord will come like a thief in the night' (1 Thessalonians 5.2). Sometimes watching, waiting and anticipating what will happen is all we can do. Yet, Jesus says for those who have eyes to see, the signs of the Kingdom are all around us. Each of us has the power to choose to love,

wherever we find ourselves, and that power can change the world. I leave you with this benediction from 'Liturgy that Matters.'

*Love is a risky endeavour, but we are made capable.
Because love lives in us, we can practise solidarity with courage.
Because love is alive around us, we can imagine new worlds together.
Because love is eternal, we can trust in it even when we struggle to perceive it.
This is the power of God in us.
Let us go and live it with faith. Amen.*

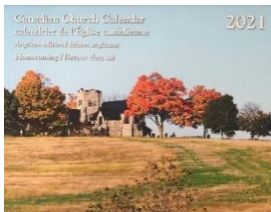
CAPITAL CAMPAIGN

PARISH FINANCES: an update from Don Thomson, Treasurer

Operating results showed continued improvement in October. October revenues exceeded expenses by \$2.6 thousand, \$7.4 thousand better than budget: October giving, including Thanksgiving envelopes, was \$3.5 thousand over budget; rental income was on budget; and expenses were \$4 thousand under budget. Thanks to you and to the Trustees who are working hard to supplement your giving with income from facilities rentals and fundraising, and who prudently manage spending to

avoid unnecessary costs while still meeting Parish objectives.

Despite the improvement, we are still facing an operating loss for the 10-month year-to-date. The year-to-date loss was \$45 thousand, \$25 thousand under better than budget but \$25 thousand worse than the same period last year. Without the Diocese assistance received earlier in the year, the year-to-date loss would have been \$100 thousand.

Year-to-date General Fund giving, at \$217 thousand, was approximately \$17 thousand less than budget and \$55 thousand less than last year. The shortfall was due to one-off donations to the General Fund received last year that have not been repeated, but the impact has been partially offset by identified giving which was \$13 thousand more than budgeted. Thank you for your continuing support, and for taking advantage of the PAD and online donation options. With facilities closed through the end of August, and the continuing impact of physical distancing, year-to-date rental income was \$21 thousand less than budgeted and the \$11 thousand budgeted rummage sale fundraising was not achieved.

The government's wage subsidy reduced salaries expense by \$18 thousand; the Diocesan waiver reduced its assessment by \$37 thousand; and we have managed to keep other expenses at \$88 thousand, \$21 thousand under budget and \$19 thousand less than year-to-date 2019. My current expectation, subject to any increase in donations, is that the 2020 operating loss will be roughly in the range of the budgeted \$60 thousand loss (without government and Diocesan assistance, a \$60 thousand loss would have been a \$115 thousand loss). A loss of that magnitude is far more than any previous annual operating loss.

Planning for 2021 and beyond continues, reflecting the Parish vision and taking into account our current circumstances, challenges and opportunities while addressing financial sustainability.

Your annual pledges and one-off gifts sustain our current operations; your commitment to our 3-year Capital Campaign is enabling restoration, renewal and reimagining of the Parish to meet the spiritual and physical needs of our community going forward.
