1. Observation

- What does Scripture say?

2. Interpretation

- What does Scripture mean?

3. Application

- How should I respond?

1. Observation

What does Scripture say?

1. ASK Questions

I keep six honest serving-men (They taught me all I knew); Their names are <u>What</u> and <u>Why</u> and <u>When</u> And <u>How</u> and <u>Where</u> and <u>Who</u>.

 - Is the writer?
 - Are the original readers?
 - Is the text taking place?


- -What?
 - Is happening in the text?
 - Is wrong with the picture?
 - Is the author saying?

- -Why?
 - Is the author writing this?
 - Is this included in Scripture?
 - Did the events happen the way they did?
 - Did the author say what he said?
 - Did the author say it the way he did?

- -How?
 - Is the author making his point?
 - Are the events being described?

Perishing in Jonah

The captain doesn't want to perish

■ 1:6 –" Perhaps the god will give a thought to us, that we may not perish."

The sailors don't want to perish

■ 1:14 –"O LORD, let us not **perish** for this man's life"

The Ninevites don't want to perish

■ 3:9 –"God may ...turn from his fierce anger, so that we may not **perish**."

Jonah doesn't want his plant to perish

• 4:10 –"you pity the plant, for which you did not labor, nor did you make it grow, which came into being in a night and **perished** in a night."

Jonah 1:1-4

Now the word of the Lord came to Jonah the son of Amittai, saying, "Arise, go to Nineveh, that great city, and call out against it, for their evil has come up before me." **But** Jonah rose to flee to Tarshish from the presence of the Lord. He went down to Joppa and found a ship going to Tarshish. So he paid the fare and went down into it, to go with them to Tarshish, away from the presence of the Lord. **But** the Lord hurled a great wind upon the sea, and there was a mighty tempest on the sea, so that the ship threatened to break up.

Ephesians 1:3-14

³ Blessed be the God and Father of our Lord Jesus Christ, who has blessed us in Christ with every spiritual blessing in the heavenly places, even as he chose us in him before the foundation of the world, that we should be holy and blameless before him. In love 5 he predestined <u>us</u> for adoption to himself as sons through Jesus Christ, according to the purpose of his will, ⁶ to the praise of his glorious grace, with which he has blessed <u>us</u> in the Beloved. ⁷ In him <u>we</u> have redemption through his blood, the forgiveness of our trespasses, according to the riches of his grace, 8 which he lavished upon us, in all wisdom and insight 9 making known to us the mystery of his will, according to his purpose, which he set forth in Christ 10 as a plan for the fullness of time, to unite all things in him, things in heaven and things on earth. 11 In him we have obtained an inheritance, having been predestined according to the purpose of him who works all things according to the counsel of his will, 12 so that we who were the first to hope in Christ might be to the praise of his glory. 13 In him you also, when you heard the word of truth, the gospel of your salvation, and believed in him, were sealed with the promised Holy Spirit, 14 who is the guarantee of our inheritance until we acquire possession of it, to the praise of his glory.

- 2. LOOK Carefully
 - -Look at major shifts
 - -Look at metaphors
 - -Look at comparisons
 - -Look at contrasts
 - -Look at tone

Interpret the Old in Light of the New



The Goal of Interpretation

The goal of Bible interpretation is to understand what the author intended to communicate to his original audience.

-It doesn't matter what Scripture means to <u>you</u>, but what Scripture <u>means</u>.

The Necessity of Application

 Matthew 7:24—"Everyone then who hears these words of mine and does them will be like a wise man who built his house on the rock."

• 1 Timothy 3:16-17—"All Scripture is breathed out by God and profitable for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, that the man of God may be complete, equipped for every good work."

James 1:22—"But be doers of the word, and not hearers only, deceiving yourselves."

Interpretation	Application
What does the text mean?	How do I respond?
Single meaning	Multiple responses
Same for all Christians	Varies, based on individual, life circumstances, etc.
Us getting into the Word	The Word getting into us

Four Steps for APPLICATION

- 1. Uncover the Timeless Truth(s)
- 2. Meditate on the Timeless Truth(s)
- 3. Relate the Timeless Truth(s) to Today
- 4. Practice the Timeless Truth(s)

Philippians 4:13

"I can do all things through Him who strengthens me"



Four Steps for APPLICATION

- 1. Uncover the Timeless Truth(s)
 - Jesus strengthens His people to endure difficulties for the sake of the gospel.
- 2. Meditate on the Timeless Truth(s)
- 3. Relate the Timeless Truth(s) to Today
 - What difficulties am I enduring for the sake of the gospel?
 - -What strength do I need to endure?
- 4. Practice the Timeless Truth(s)

- 1. Who Should I Be?
- 2. How Should I Think?
- 3. What Should I Do?
- 4. Where Should I Go?
- 5. Who Will I Teach?
