"The Directions of Prayer" - Matthew 6:5-15

Introduction

- The day I was called "Daddy"
- The context of "The Lord's Prayer"

 - ♦ Christian prayer is not trying to manipulate God or impress others
- The directions of "The Lord's Prayer": Up, In, Out

Up

- A "big" God
- ♦ Knowable (our), Personal (Father), Sovereign (in heaven), Pure (hallowed)
- Worship is the foundation of a deepening life of prayer
 - ♦ Removes us from the centre
 - ♦ Builds faith

In

- Two prayers of submission: "your will be done" and "our daily bread"
- "Our daily bread"
 - ♦ Not just about food!
 - ♦ Freedom from fear that there won't be enough
- "Your will be done"
 - ♦ "Your will be done" means "not my will be done"
 - ♦ It's about obedience
 - ♦ What's the next step of obedience in your relationship with Jesus?

Out

- Forgiveness and Deliverance
 - ♦ Forgiveness of others turns our prayers and lives towards others
 - * Story of an imprisoned friend
 - Deliverance from evil keeps us strong in the world
 - * God does not tempt us (James 1:13)
 - * But trials and temptations remind us to turn to the Lord for his strength (James 1:2-3)
 - * Paul and "the thorn in the flesh" (2 Corinthians 12)
- Praying for a clearer revelation of God's grace and power
