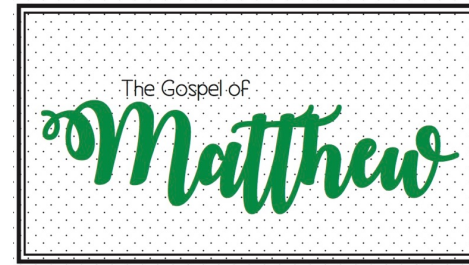


**Life Group Questions
