
or interrupt our fantasies, or call attention to our lapses.

## 2. The Divine Knowledge

"I know your works" (v8)

- A commendation is given to the church for their faithful service (v10)
- "your patient endurance" you have not denied me (v8)

An 'open door' will be given to them:

- an open door of opportunity/ of ministry even though they are seen as weak by the broader community – 'you have but little power'
- God knows the heart & evaluates differently than the world does


"they will learn that I have loved you" (v9b)

• Those who deny me will see that you are vindicated


• So we have the assurance that Christ loves us now and forever


"Christ will keep us" (v10)

- Christ is coming soon (v11) so keep trusting in his ultimate protection






