LENT | 40 Days of Focus

ach year on Ash Wednesday,

- the first day of Lent,
- the liturgy of the
 - Church calls us to
- begin "a holy season
- of prayerful and
- penitential reflection,"
- when "our attention

is especially directed to the holy sufferings and death of our Lord Jesus Christ."

The words used in the Ash
Wednesday rite of the Lutheran
Service Book Agenda also remind us
that "from ancient times the season
of Lent has been kept as a time of
special devotion, self-denial, and
humble repentance born of a faithful
heart that dwells confidently on His
Word and draws from it life and
hope."

Each of the seasons of the church year is observed and celebrated, but Lent, and only Lent, is "kept." The holy season of Lent invites us to be "keepers"—the people of God who keep the fast, keep the silence, and keep the focus throughout this singular season.



As we move into our Lenten season, here are 7 reasons why we believe "keeping" Lent is important:

UINTROSPECTION IS

IMPORTANT | Give yourself an intentional season to examine your heart and ways.

CREATE MARGIN | Leave time and space open for God.
Breathing room. We all need this.

3 READ THE GOOD FROM

SACRIFICE | Abstaining for self-promoting desires helps us relate to Jesus and how He suffered. Consider giving up a luxury or habit for this season.

② DEVELOP FOCUS | We need to practice paying attention to what we pay attention to.

- Pick up ONE | to replace the thing you've given up. If you're giving up an indulgence, pick up the habit of prayer when you're feeling the desire to give in. If you're giving up an activity, spend your newfound time studying Scripture.
- pot sin issues, let's be honest. Take the thing you really want to work on, and ask the Lord to help you eliminate it from your life. Gluttony. Character deficiency. Road rage. Poor time management. God is bigger than the temptations you face.

While this all sounds very much about the things we do, they are only tools to draw nearer to God in preparation for Easter. It's not about what we do. It's about what He has done.

Your passport to Odyssey

ur Passport to Odyssey program has launched and is off to a great start! Each Sunday morning, our travelers head back to the Holy Lands to meet the characters of the Bible and watch as Jesus' ministry unfolds around them. New travelers are always welcome! Children ages 3 thru 5th grade are invited to come with us as we journey through God's redemption story and learn how we fit into His big plan! Odyssey will be happening every week, year-round, with the exception of Unity Sundays, so always plan on Odyssey!

Odyssey starts at 9:30 in the Sanctuary with worship during the Modern service. Please check your children in at the check-in station in the Narthex prior to entering the sanctuary. At 9:45, the children leave to travel with Odyssey. They will meet in the "customs room" to get their lanyards, have their passports stamped, and get into groups (they might enjoy a little sing-a-long time as well). Then they are off to their journey where they'll watch and play along with the story in the Day Tours room. They do a craft to help learn the story in the market place, and then visit the Synagogue to dive into the Bible. Passport to Odyssey concludes at 10:45 am, which is when parents can head down to the Fellowship Hall and into the Odyssey hallway to collect their children.

Odyssey Volunteers Needed!

Tour Director | Leads a group of sessions, makes sure we have enough volunteers scheduled, distributes tour itinerary to volunteers, leads Customs room, and makes sure the Staging Room is stocked with everything needed for that block of tours. This can be done individually or with a group of up to 3 people. Directors will serve for 4-5 consecutive weeks (one month).

Tour Guide | Navigates travelers to the different rooms each week and keeps travelers in line with the rules. This position is more flexible in scheduling in that you can serve one week at a time (please wear a Hawaiian shirt or tourist garb).

Rabbi in the Synagogue | Leads that week's Bible story. Also flexible in scheduling, can serve one week at a time.

Check-In | Be present at the table in the Narthex and help get children checked in to the program. Also, unlocks the door from the Fellowship Hall at 10:45 and helps parents find their children, as needed. This can be a one week at a time position.

Craft/Décor Prep | Work behind the scenes preparing craft projects and setting up rooms when we transition between blocks of lessons. Jobs/needs will be coordinated by Tour Directors. Depending on curriculum, some tasks could be done at home.
