



Adventures in Mask-Making

My first job right out of high school was as an assistant 4H leader teaching kids how to sew, beginning with little gingham aprons. I was quite a seamstress back in the day, but my sewing machine has been pretty much dormant for several decades.

Then Covid-19 hit in early 2020 and PPE for healthcare and other essential workers was in short supply. The call went out for volunteers to rev up production, so I dusted off and oiled old reliable. Because stores were closed at the time, I dug through my bin of miscellaneous fabric. For my first batch, I cut up Nathan's colorful old crib sheet for the outer layer and a "Joe for President 2008" tee-shirt (sorry Joe) for the mask liner.

I next sacrificed my own pink gingham 4H apron I made in 1963 to make 12 masks. I retroactively awarded my apron a Blue Ribbon, for participation if not for quality. Then, I started cutting up old sheets, and I've become a regular customer at Joanne Fabric once stores started opening.

My first masks went to an assisted living facility and to a Covid recovery facility for people without homes. The Navajo Nation, hard-hit by the virus, was in need of masks. I set to work with my friend from Friendship Bible Study, Teresa Minor, whose mother was Lakota Sioux, and we sent 60 masks to them.

Then Lutheran World Relief announced a 75,000 mask challenge so it can include face masks in international shipments of personal care kits to communities in need already scheduled for summer and fall. Challenge accepted! With \$250 of seed money from Thrivent Financial, the St. Andrew's team consisting of me, Teresa Minor, and Grace Musko sent 400 masks to LWR. Even better news: the challenge has garnered over 123,000 masks, and counting!

Area mask-makers have now started to donate masks to local schools as they prepare to reopen. So far, I've given 150 to the Speedway schools, many in SHS school colors of brown and gold. Go Spark Plugs!

Sadly, the pandemic prevented the St. Andrew's Friendship Bible Study from offering our usual spring and summer activities and will most likely delay in-person classes this fall. To help keep in touch with our friends with disabilities, we are putting together gift bags which will include both fun and useful items, such as hand sanitizer and face masks, which are works-in-progress on my sewing table.

When 2020 began, I'm sure none of us could foresee what we would be doing as the year unfolded. I certainly didn't anticipate making more than 1000 face masks to help slow the spread of Covid-19 in our community and in far corners of the world. It's been gratifying to be a small part in the effort, but I'm looking forward to the day when such precautions are no longer needed. Until then, let's support one another, and may God bless and keep us all!
