

A) Ac bai all. 42 All the believers devoted themselves to the apostle s teaching, and to fellowship, and to sharing in meals (including the Lord's Supper), and to prayer. <sup>43</sup> A deep sense of awe came over them all, and the apostles performed many miraculous signs and wonders. <sup>44</sup> And all the believers met together in one place and shared everything they had. 45 They sold their property and possessions and shared the money with those in need. 46 They worshiped together at the Temple each day, met in homes for the Lord's Supper, and shared their meals with great joy and generosity—47 all the while praising God and enjoying the goodwill of all the people. And each day the Lord added to their fellowship those who were being saved.

## Who is your church?

The question is not, "Where do you go to church?" but rather, "Who is your church?" Who are the people with whom you are being the church?



We practice these 9 things as we grow in our faith together. This is what the church is supposed to do. You have already learned about some of these in previous Sessions: You have learned how to care for each other. In Session 2 Baptism was explained, in Session 3 Prayer, Session 4 Bible Study, and in Sessions 1 & 2 you were taught how to share your faith & Make Disciples.

But there are 3 practices that may need further explanation:

#### UNDERSTANDING FINANCIAL GIVING

6) 2 Corinthians 9:6-7 (NLT) "Remember this -- a farmer who plants only a few seeds will get a small crop. But the one who plants generously will get a generous crop. You must each make up your own mind as to how much you should give. Don't give reluctantly or in response to pressure. For God loves the person who gives cheerfully."

#### UNDERSTANDING THE LORD'S SUPPER

7) 1 Corinthians 11:23–26 (NLT) For I pass on to you what I received from the Lord himself. On the night when he was betrayed, the Lord Jesus took some bread <sup>24</sup> and gave thanks to God for it. Then he broke it in pieces and said, "This is my body, which is given for you. Do this to remember me." <sup>25</sup> In the same way, he took the cup of wine after supper, saying, "This cup is the new covenant between God and his people—an agreement confirmed with my blood. Do this to remember me as often as you drink it." <sup>26</sup> For every time you eat this bread and drink this cup, you are announcing the Lord's death until he comes again.

When and where can you share the Lord's Supper with other Christians?

UNDERSTANDING QUALIFIED LEADERS: God has provided order in the church by equipping leaders to lead His people.

8) Hebrews 13:17 (NLT) Obey your spiritual leaders, and do what they say. Their work is to watch over your souls, and they are accountable to God. Give them reason to do this with joy and not with sorrow. That would certainly not be for your benefit.
