Principles of Church Life found in the First Church of Jerusalem

- 1. A Learning Community teaching and membership
- 2. A Worshipping Community praise and communion
- 3. A Sharing Community the ministry of hospitality
- 4. A Saving Community prayer and organic evangelism

Discussion Questions based on Acts 2:42-47

- 2. What changes have you observed in church life over the years and how would you evaluate the role of the church in our culture at this time? Why?
- 3. Read the Bible passage together. What are your first impressions of features in this baby church?
- 4. Share your thoughts on how the church today relates to what is spoken of here as the "apostles teaching." What are your thoughts on the value and significance of "church membership?"
- 5. Discuss what it means that the first church was a "worshipping community" and how this can be a grater reality today.
- 6. What do you think are some practical ways for the church to practice hospitality in this season of restriction?
- 7. How can the church of today experience what is said here of the first church seeing "God do amazing things?" What are your thoughts on how the church can be more effective in evangelism in these days?
