How would you answer the question who Jesus is? Is Jesus a prophet? Or is Jesus a good moral teacher? Is Jesus a magician? Or perhaps He was someone delusional and thought that He was someone important? When you ask this question to your friends around you, how would they respond? "Who is Jesus?" is an important question because who that person is to you affects how you treat that person. For examples, if the person is a thief, you will call the police to arrest him. If the person is a bully, you will distance yourself from him. If the person is your coach, you will listen to his advice on how to play the game.

Today we will look at who Jesus is and what others thought of Jesus.

We go all the way back to the start of creation and find out the reason why we need the Messiah. We see that we have made mistakes and that we need to be redeemed. And Jesus is the promised Messiah who came to redeem us from our sins. Jesus is the Messiah, that is who He is.

4 what does the Bible Say?

What does the Bible say about who Jesus is:

- Read John 20:30–31 and Mark 1:10–11
- The Bible explicitly says that
 - Jesus is the Messiah, the Son of God (John 20:31)
 - You are my beloved **Son** [God's Son], with you I am well pleased. (Mark 1:11)
- The Bible tells us clearly who Jesus is, He is the Messiah and the Son of God.

The above passages show us that Jesus is the Son of God. And when we call Jesus the Messiah, it tells us that He is here to save us and that He is here to redeem* us.

***redemption** (Greek: apolutrosis) refers to the deliverance of Christians from sin.

Reflection:

- 1. Does the world need a Messiah, a Saviour?
- 2. Do I need Jesus to save me from my sins?

When we ask the question "Who is Jesus?", the Bible gives us these answers: Jesus is God's eternal Son and Israel's Messiah. He is the promised Savior.

It might be difficult to understand what it means when we say that Jesus is the Messiah, but that is what the New Testament invites us to believe as story unfolds in the Bible.



s how can we respond?

When we know more about Jesus, we also know God more. Jesus came to the world and all His words and actions showed us how much God loves and cares for us.

Think about who Jesus is, and how you would interact with Him.
